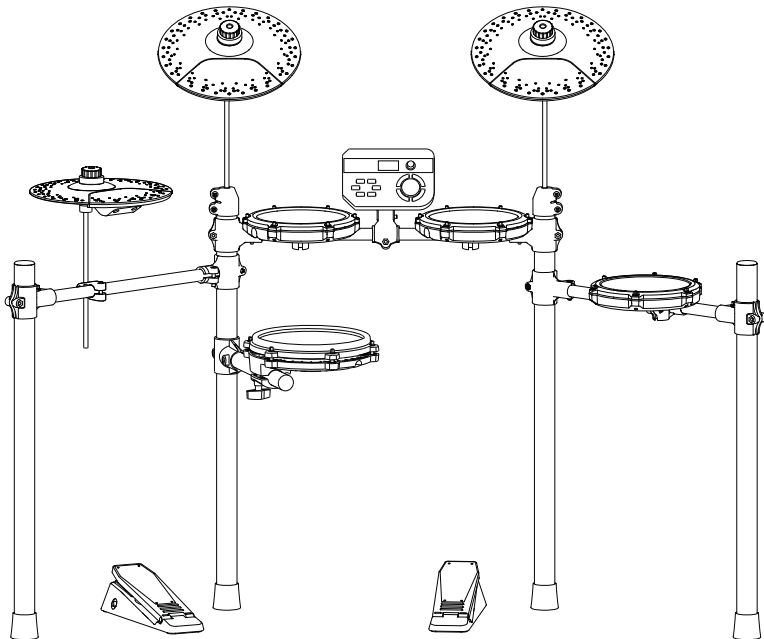

- 30 songs
- Support sensitivity parameter adjustment for each drum kit
- Three teaching modes
- Tempo control: 30 to 250 beats per minute
- Metronome: 1 ~ 4 kinds
- Other functions: Parameter storage, reset, recording;
- Interface: TYPE-C, 5V, USB, AUX IN, PHONE, OUTPUT, CRASH2.

The support pipe fittings are placed in an independent packing box in the carton. Please check whether they are complete or no.



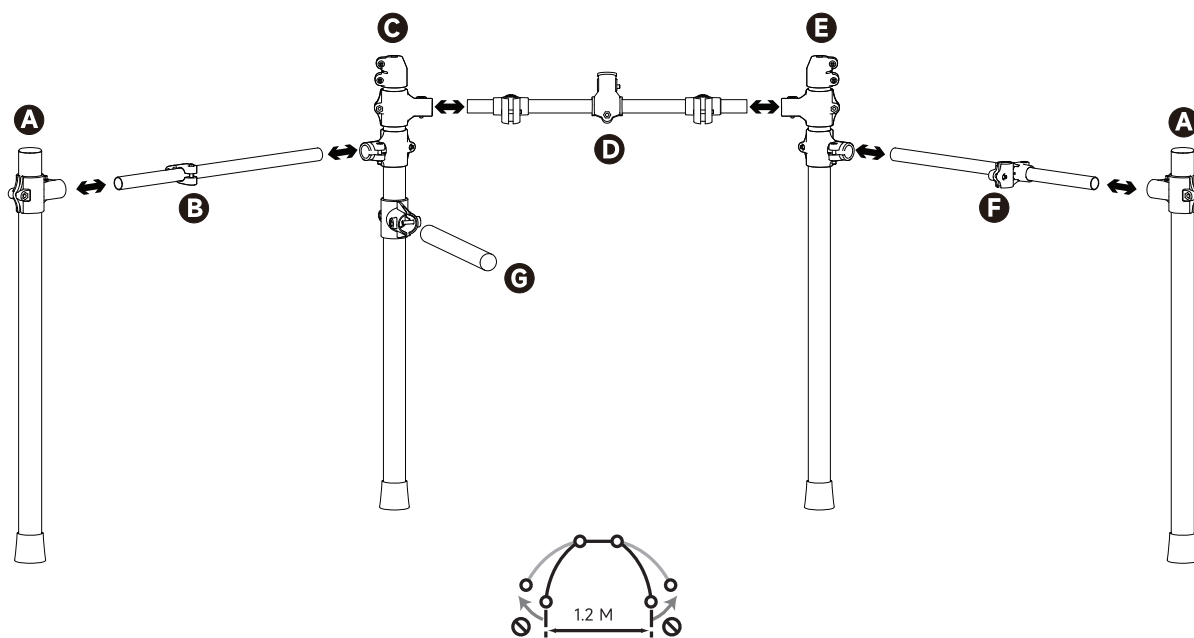

Assemble the bracket in the specified direction

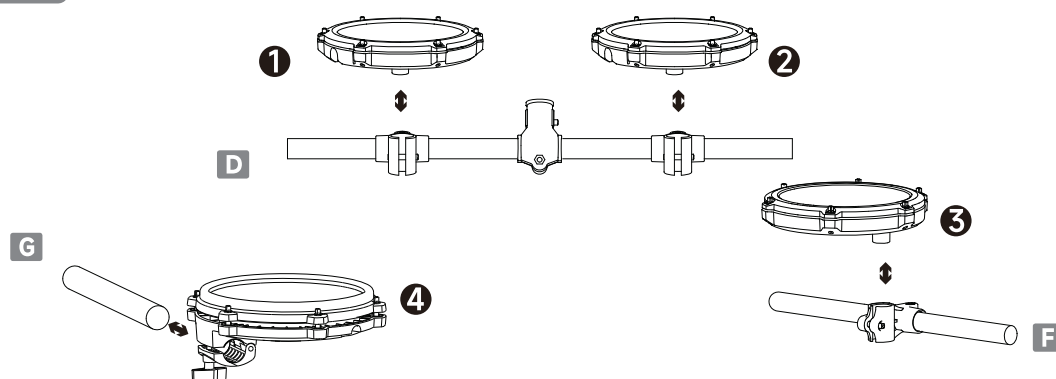


For safety considerations, the expansion width of the stand less not be greater than 1.2 meters.

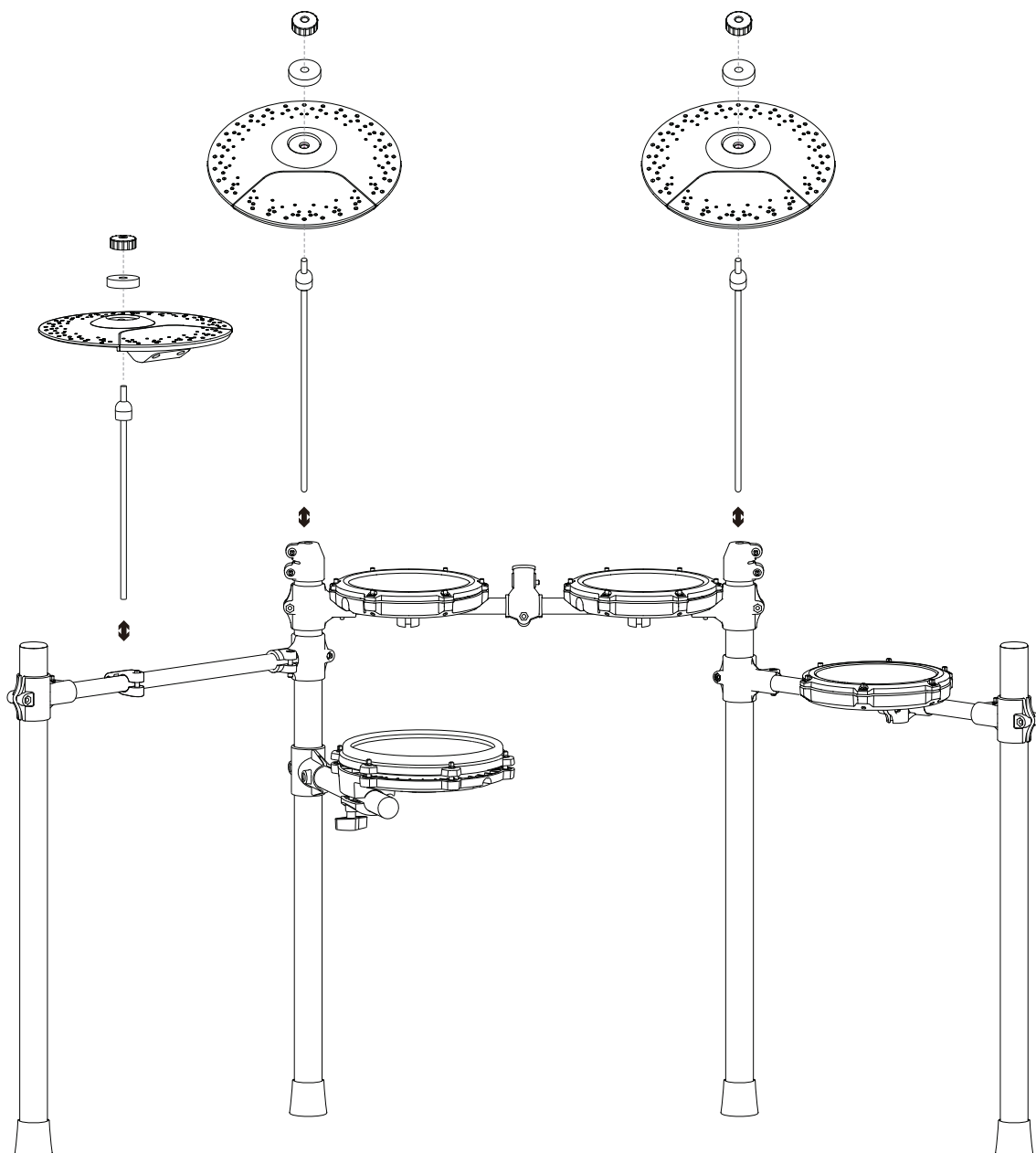
Install the hitting parts

Attention: Each cymbal, Tom drum and snare drum has different functions. they must be installed correctly with reference to the identification of accessories.



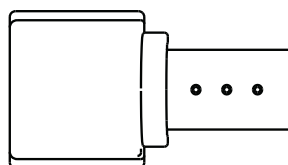
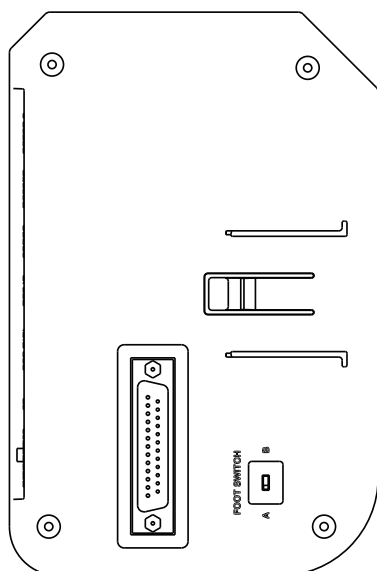

When installing, pay attention to the bracket orientation and insert it in place.

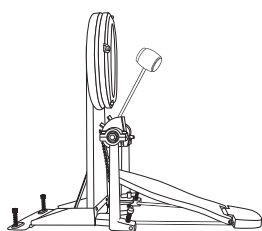


Insert the bracket of the sound module into the track of the sound module. When it is inserted to the end, you will hear the pop-up sound of the clamp.

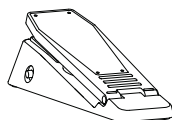

SOUND MODULE PORT DIAGRAM



1 Power adapter connection

1. Connect the power cable as illustrated: insert one end into the power socket on the drum unit housing and the other end into a 100-240V domestic mains socket (Fig 1).
2. When the product is not in use for extended periods, unplug the power cable and store it securely.

2 USB MIDI port

The MIDI USB interface of the electronic drum kit enables connection and interaction with MIDI-compatible musical devices.

1. Pre-installed software on computers or tablets facilitates learning, performance, composition, storage, and other functional operations.
2. Upon connecting to a computer or tablet, the device's audio output must be linked to the audio input jack on the drum host unit to synchronise sound effects. (Fig 5)

3 Audio input port

The audio input jack allows connection of external audio sources to the drum machine for playback (such as linear audio signals from MP3 players, mobile phones, etc.). (Fig 3)

4 Headphone port

Connecting headphones allows you to monitor subtle changes in your playing, and prevents disturbing others when practising without amplifiers. (Fig. 4)

5 Audio output port

The audio output jack permits connection to powered speakers (requiring dedicated drum monitors) and large-scale audio systems. (Fig 5)

6 CRASH2

This port can accommodate an extension drum. (Fig 6)



OPERATION GUIDE

1 POWER

1. Toggle the switch to on, the display lights up and the main unit turns on.
2. Toggle the switch to off again, the display goes off and the main unit turns off.

2 Drum Kit Selection

1. Direct selection upon startup: After powering on, the unit defaults to Drum Kit 01, with the KIT key illuminated. Rotate the data wheel or press the <+>/<-> buttons to select a drum kit.
2. Using the KIT key: Press the <KIT> key to illuminate the KIT key and enter the drum kit selection screen (numbers 01-15). Rotate the data wheel or press the <+>/<-> buttons to select the desired drum kit.

3 CLICK

1. Press the <CLICK> button. The indicator light jumps to the “CLICK” button, entering metronome mode. Press the <▶|> button to start playback. The screen displays 120 (tempo value). Rotate the data wheel or press the <+>/<-> buttons to adjust the metronome speed.
2. In metronome mode, press the <SELECT> button to enter the metronome parameter adjustment interface. Use the <+>/<-> buttons to select the parameter type you wish to adjust, then turn the data wheel to modify the setting:
 - r.4 (beat type) b04 (beats per measure) L25 (metronome volume)
3. After adjusting parameters, press the <SELECT> button to confirm and exit the parameter interface (metronome speed value is linked to both “COACH” mode and “SONG” mode).

4 COACH Mode

The “COACH” mode of this product helps build speed, accuracy, and endurance, offering practice functions to cultivate better rhythm.

Progress under the guidance of “COACH” mode!

Press the “COACH” button to enter coaching mode, where the button illuminates. Three practice modes are available in this mode, selectable via the data wheel or <+>/<-> buttons.

1. Press the <COACH> button to display C-1 (Practice Mode 1) for striking practice. Rotate the data wheel to switch between the other two practice modes, C-2 and C-3. Press the <▶|> button to activate the metronome and begin practicing by striking the drum pad.
2. After four preparatory beats, the display will show.

Practice Mode

1. Practice Mode 1: C-1 Beat Detection Practice: Strike the drum pad to the steady beat at a fixed tempo to train striking accuracy.
2. Practice Mode 2: C-2 Silent Striking Mode: The metronome sounds for one measure and remains silent for the next, training accuracy without metronome cues. This is an advanced version of Practice Mode 1.
3. Practice Mode 3: C-3 Speed Striking Practice: The metronome automatically increases from slowest to fastest tempo, then decreases from fastest to slowest, building striking endurance.
4. Upon completion, the entire practice session receives a score from 0-100, indicating current accuracy.
5. 2. In C-1 mode, press the <SELECT> button to enter the parameter settings screen. Here, you can adjust the number of beats for the current practice mode, allowing you to customize the practice session based on your desired beat count.
6. In C-2 mode, press the <SELECT> button to enter the parameter settings interface. Here, you can adjust the number of bars for the practice mode, allowing you to set the practice duration based on the desired number of bars to practice.
7. In C-3 mode, press the <SELECT> button to enter the parameter settings interface. Here, you can adjust the variable for the current BPM. This variable determines the numerical value by which the tempo changes each time.
8. During practice, you can press the <▶|> button again to stop the practice session.

5 SONG

1. Press the <SONG> button to enter Song Mode. When the indicator light jumps to the fourth button on the left labelled 'SONG', the screen displays 01 (song number). Use the data wheel or the <+><-> buttons to select. Press the <▶|> button to begin playing the song. Press the <▶|> button again to pause playback.
2. In song mode, press the <SELECT> button to navigate to the song parameter settings screen. The practice song drum sound can be disabled; the default setting is ON. Use the data wheel to select ON/OFF.
3. After adjusting parameters, press the <SELECT> button to confirm and exit the parameter settings screen.

6 Drum parameters

1. Press <KIT>; the indicator light will jump to the leftmost 'KIT' button. When the screen displays 01 (kit number), press <SELECT> to enter the drum pad parameter adjustment mode.
2. Use the <+><-> buttons to select the sensitivity option you wish to adjust. Rotate the Quick Select wheel to modify the parameter. Press and hold the <-> button until the screen displays SAV to successfully save these parameters:

• S03 (Surface Sensitivity)	T05 (Trigger Threshold)	c05 (Crosstalk Threshold)
• r05 (Repeat Trigger)	v01 (Snare Curve)	L25 (Snare Volume)
3. Added u (Tone Selection): Tap the desired snare, then rotate the data wheel to select. Press and hold <-> until the screen displays SAV to save successfully. Press the custom kit key displaying 016 to recall this kit.

- All pad settings are factory-calibrated to match the audio module. Do not alter pad parameters unless experiencing unresponsive triggering, multiple hits, or crosstalk. Should such issues arise after adjustment, press and hold the <+> button to restore factory settings.

7 REC●

1. Press the <REC●> button; the screen displays 'REC' in a breathing-flashing state, entering recording readiness mode.
2. Strike any pad to sound the metronome; the screen displays '---' in a breathing-flashing state, commencing recording.
3. Press the <REC●> button or <▶|> again to stop recording; the screen displays 'A-1'.
4. Press the <▶|> button to playback the current recording; press again to stop playback.
5. If you re-enter recording readiness mode without striking any pads, the previously recorded 'A-1' will playback.

8 SAV/RES

1. Press and hold the <-> button until the screen displays SAV to confirm successful saving.
2. Press and hold the <+> button until the screen displays RES to confirm successful reset, restoring factory settings.

9 USBMIDI

1. Using a USB-B cable, connect the device to your PC via the USB port.
2. Select this device from your MIDI devices.

10 TONE

1. In KIT mode, independent drum pad tone settings have been added.
2. Select your preferred tone, then hold down the <-> button to save. User-defined settings will be saved directly to tone slot 16.
3. Press the <TONE> button to quickly recall the 16th drum kit.
