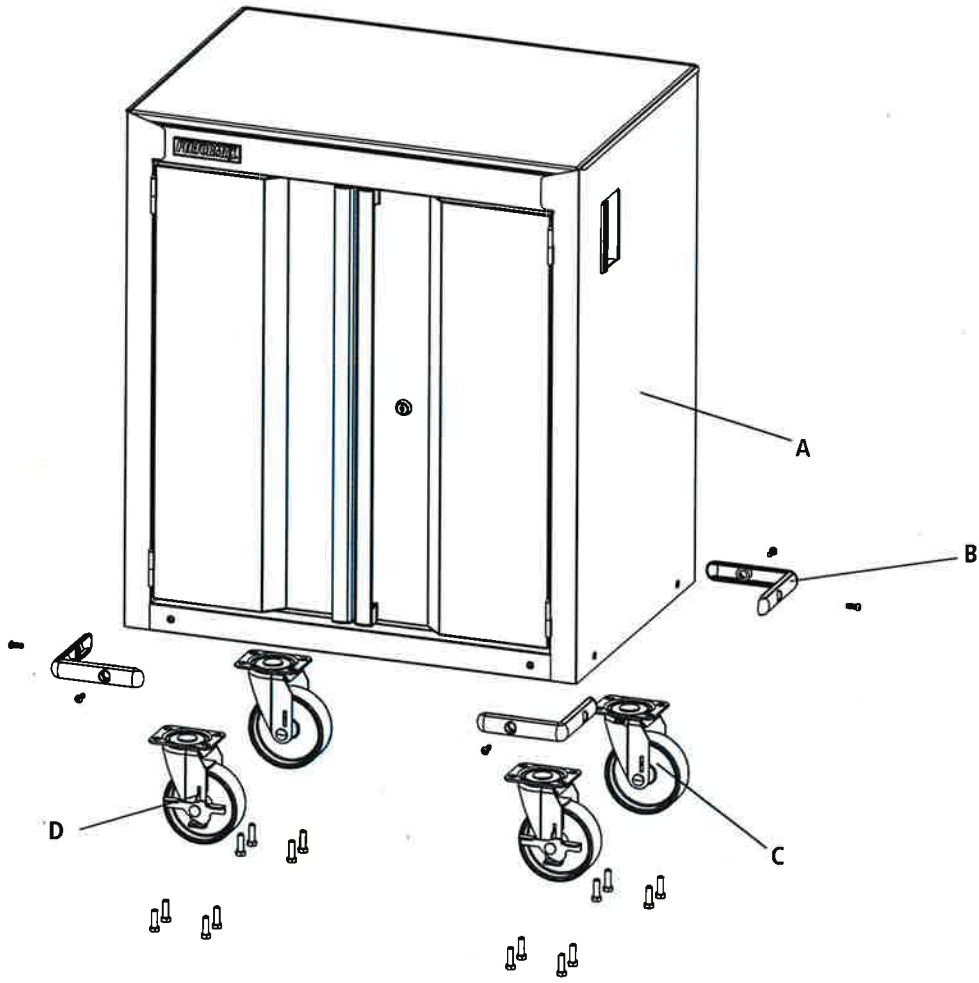

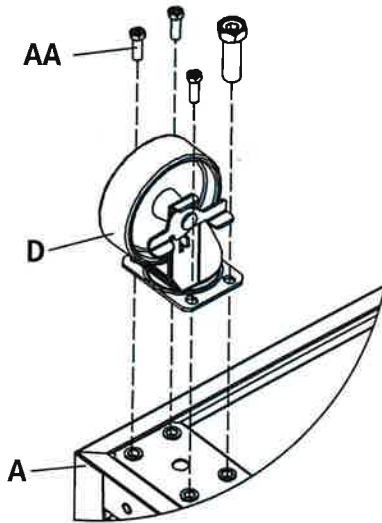

- Attach the swivel casters with brake (D) on the front of the unit inserting four bolts (AA) per caster into the cabinet (A).
- Tighten with supplied hex key (CC).
- Attach the swivel casters without brake (C) on the back of the unit inserting four bolts (AA) per caster into the cabinet (A).
- Return the cabinet (A) to its upright position.

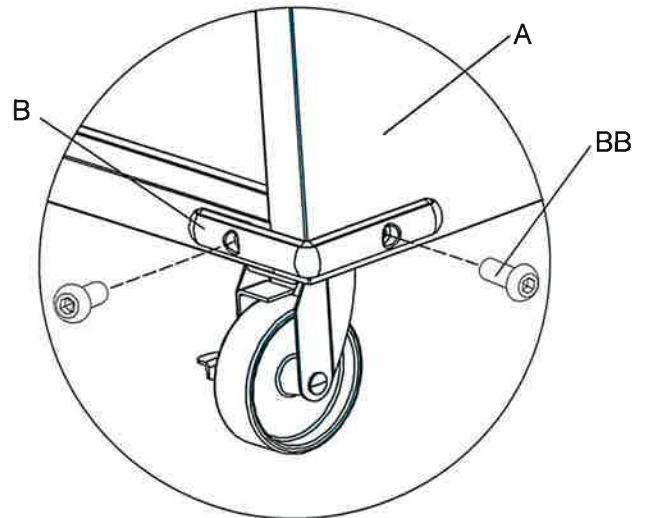

2 Attaching the bumpers

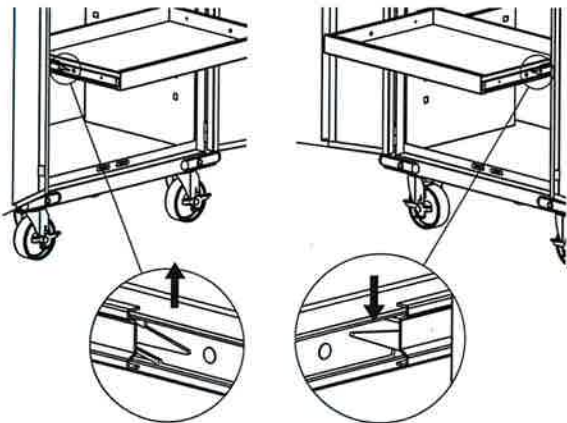
- Position the bumpers (B) over the corner holes. Insert 2 bolts (BB) into bumper holes and tighten with supplied Hex key (CC). Do not over tighten.

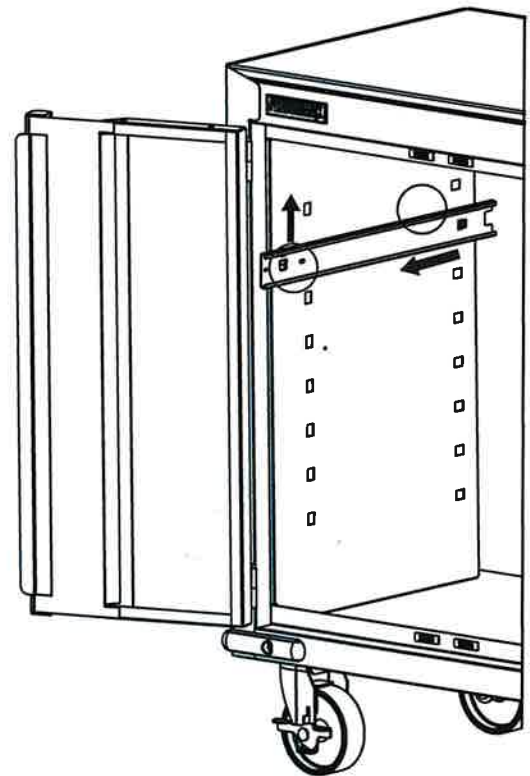
1 Removing the sliding tray

- Fully extend the empty sliding tray.
- Push up the one release lever while pulling down on the other release lever.
- Pull the tray outward until it is released from the tray slide.



2 Sliding tray height adjustment

- With the sliding tray removed, push up at the front of the outer slide to release the clip from the side panel groove and then pull outward to remove.
- Determine the desired height of your shelf.
- Insert the back clip of the outer slide, and then push down to lock the front clip into the groove of the side panel.



3 Re-inserting the sliding tray

- Extend the tray slides.
- Insert the brackets on each side of the tray into the slots in the slides, being careful that they are properly positioned.
- Once properly inserted, completely close the tray to set the slides in their proper positions.

1 Unpacking instructions

- After opening shipping box, remove protective cardboard from the top of the wood table and place cardboard on the floor.
- With the aid of an assistant, remove wood table and lay topside down on cardboard to protect the wood from scratching.
- Remove the remainder of workbench parts from shipping box. Check parts and hardware against the PARTS and HARDWARE lists on the next page. If parts or hardware are missing, please call 1-866-441-5080 for assistance.

2 Attaching the Leveling Feet

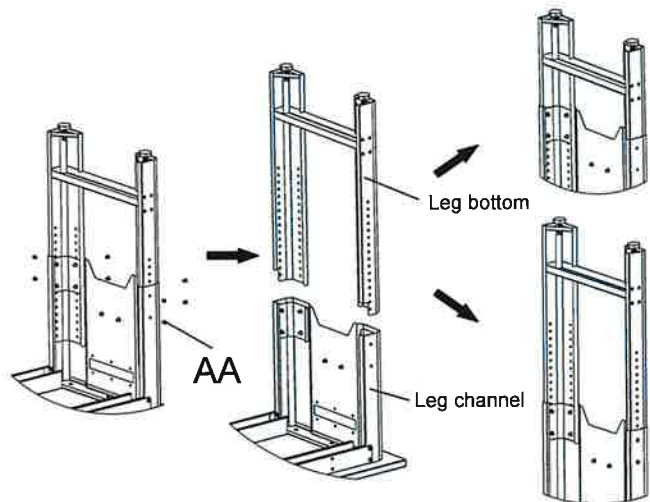
- Attach the four Leveling Feet (CC) to the Left (D) and Right Leg Panels (E) and tighten.



3 Workbench Height Adjustment

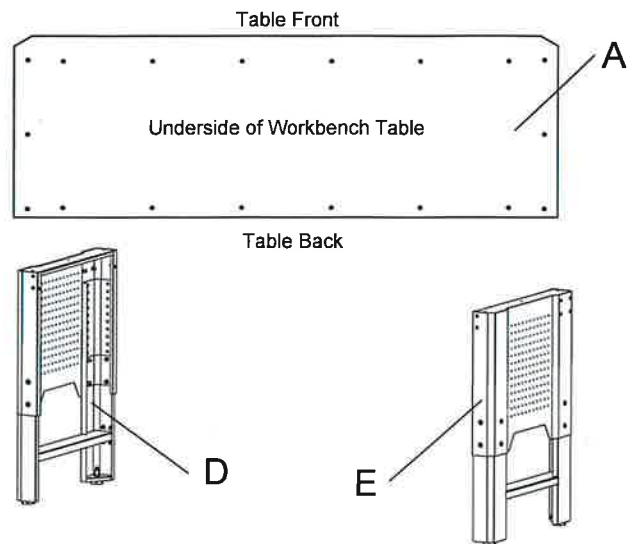
The Leg Panels are pre-set for a total workbench height of 36 inches (not including leveling feet). The Leg Panels can be adjusted to alter the workbench height from 32 inches to 42 inches.

- Completely unscrew the Screws (AA) from each Leg Panel as shown in figure below.
- Raise or lower the leg bottoms to the same position in the leg channels on each Leg Panel.
- Insert and securely tighten the previously removed screws.
- Ensure 8 Screws (AA) are used to secure the Leg Panels.



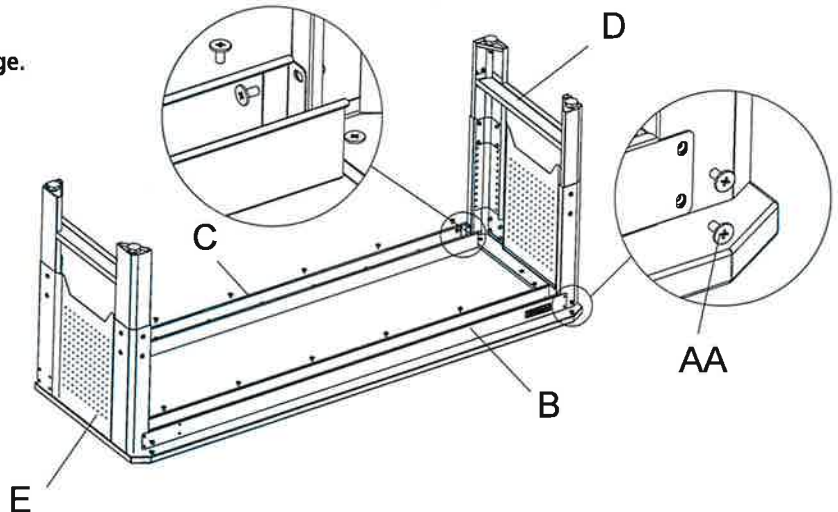
4 Attaching the Wood Table

- Determine the front and back of table. Leg Panels must be attached to the table with Back Rail attachment holes to the back of table.
- Attach the Left (D) and Right Leg Panels (E) to the underside of the Workbench Table (A):
- Align the pre-drilled holes in Table with holes in top of Legs.
- Partially tighten 3 Screws (AA) through each Leg into the Table as shown in the figure below. Do not fully tighten the Screws to allow for proper installation of the Crossbar attachments.



5 Attaching the Crossbars

- The Front Crossbar (B) has PREFORMAX badge.
- Attach Front Crossbar (B) to front of Table and Rear Crossbar (C) to back of Table
- Align the pre-drilled holes in Table with holes in Crossbar length.
- Partially tighten Screws (AA) through each Crossbar (B,C) into Table .
- Align Crossbar (B,C) end holes with holes in Left and Right Legs (D, E).
- On each end of Crossbar, partially tighten screws (AA) through Crossbar holes into Leg holes as shown in figure below. Note: The Crossbar end flanges must be attached so that they are on the outside of the Leg Panels.
- Go back and tighten all Screws (AA)

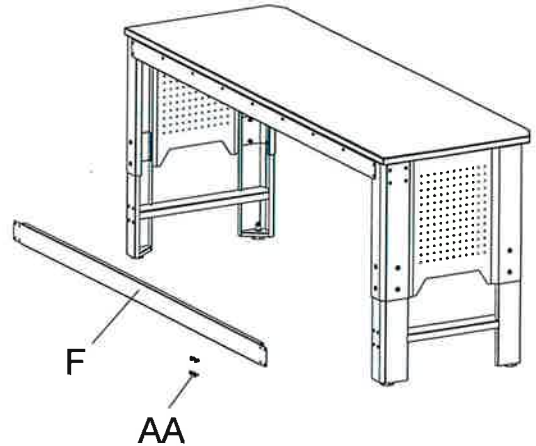


CAUTION: Ensure all Screws are properly tightened before flipping the Workbench over.

6 Attaching the Back Rail

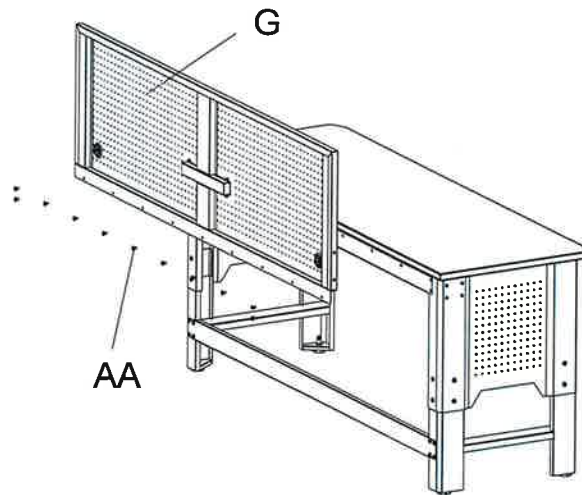
- Attach Back Rail (F) to back of Left and Right Leg Panel (D,E). Align Back Rail end holes with holes in back of Left and Right Legs.
- Install and tighten 4 Screws (AA) through Back Rail end holes into Leg holes as shown in figure below.

Note: The Back Rail end flanges must be attached so that they are on the outside of the Leg Panels.



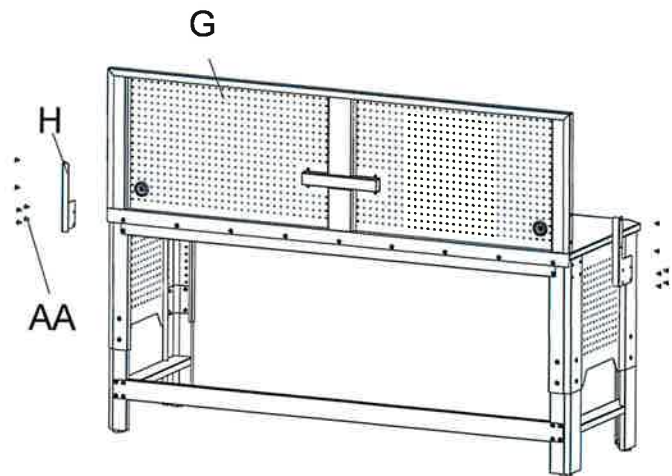
7 Attaching the Pegboard

- With the help of another person, carefully lift the Pegboard (G) into the upright position as shown.
- Align Pegboard (G) end holes with holes in Rear Crossbar (C).
- Install and tighten 11 Screws (AA) through Pegboard (G) holes into Rear Crossbar (C) holes as shown in the figure.



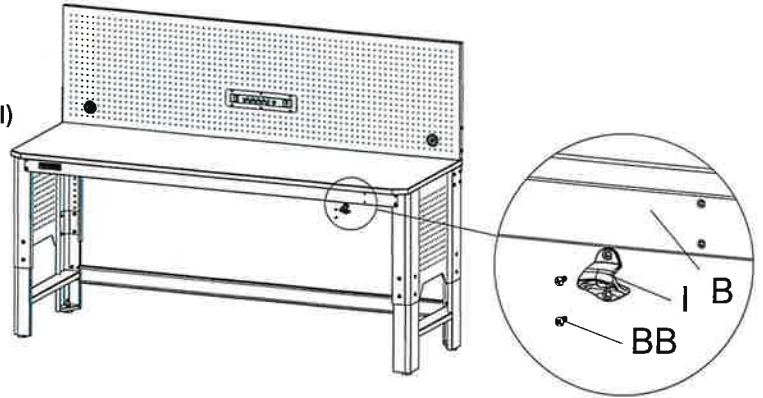
8 Attaching the L bracket

- Position the L-bracket (H) over the holes on the Pegboard (G) and the workbench.
- Tighten 6 Screws (AA) through the L-bracket (H) into Pegboard (G) and the workbench.
- Repeat this process for the other side of the Pegboard (G) to attach it to the workbench.
- Once the L bracket is attached, go back and fully tighten all screws.



9 Attaching the Bottle Opener

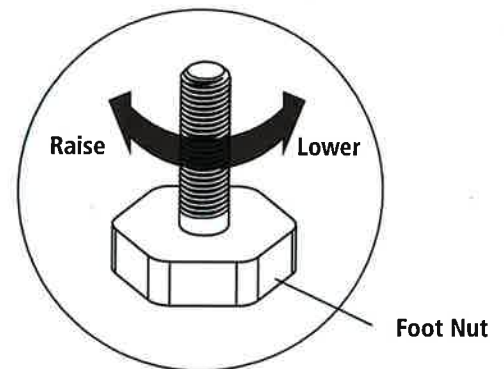
- Tighten 2 Screws (BB) through the Bottle Opener (I) holes into Front Crossbar (B) holes as shown in the figure.



Operation

1 Leveling Foot Adjustment

- Adjust leveling position by turning the foot nut left to raise and right to lower the foot.

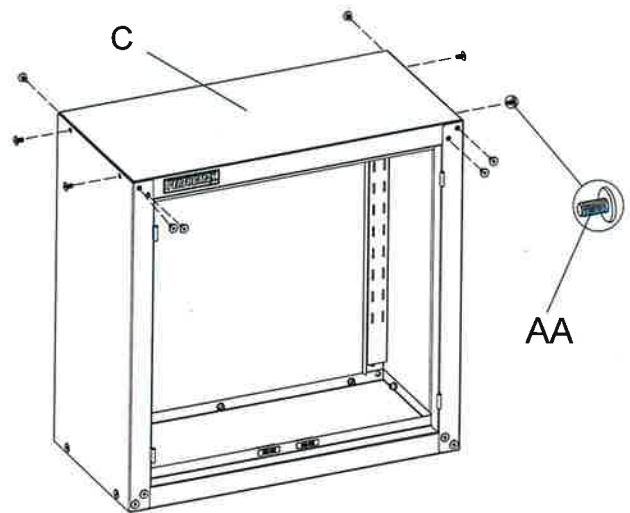
2 Attaching the Side Panel

- Do not fully tighten.



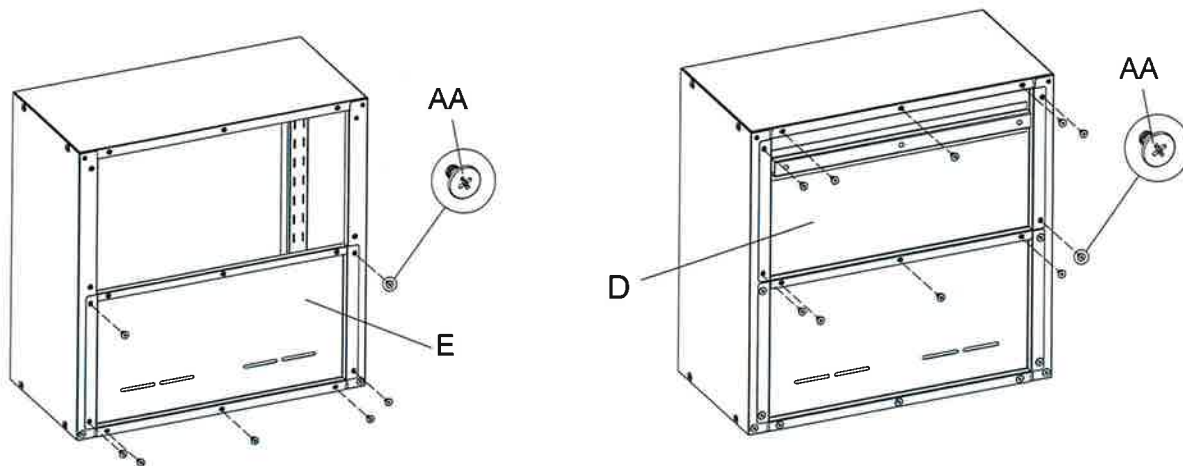
3 Attaching the Top Panel

- Attach Top Panel (C) to the Side Panels (I,J). Align holes on the sides and back and secure with 10 Screws (AA).
- Do not fully tighten.



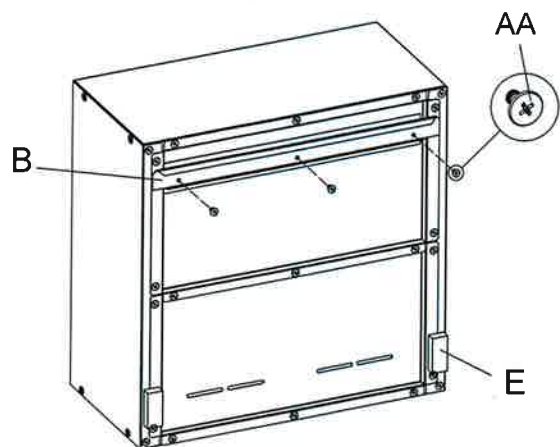
4 Attaching Back Panel

- Attach Back Panel-bottom (E) inside the two side panels and bottom. Align and insert 7 Screws (AA) into holes but do not fully tighten.
- Attach Back Panel-top (D) inside the two side panels and bottom. Align and insert 10 Screws (AA) into holes but do not fully tighten.



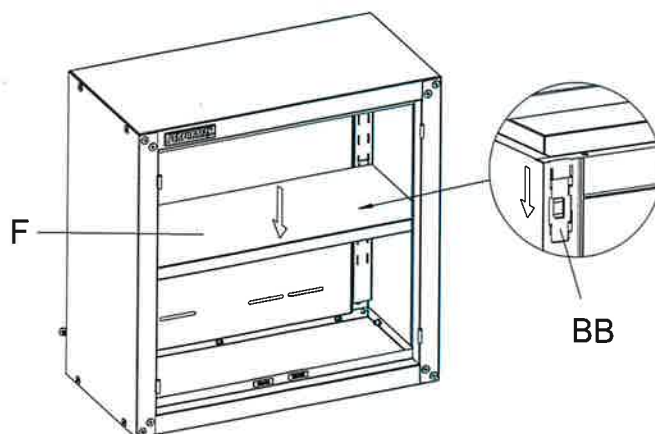
5 Attaching Hanger

- Align Hanger (B) mounting holes to the Back Panel (C) and fasten with 3 Screws (AA).



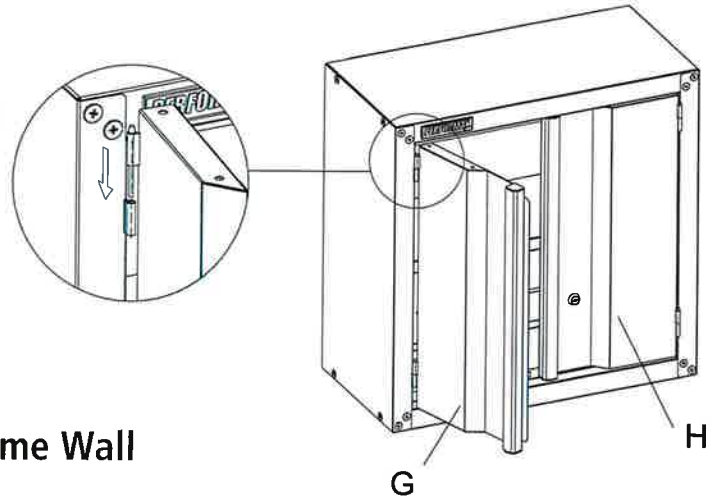
6 Attaching Adjustable Shelf

- Determine the desired height of your shelf.
- Attach and install the 4 Shelf Mounts (BB) to the front and rear corners.
- Insert Adjustable Shelf (F) into cabinet.



6 Attaching the door

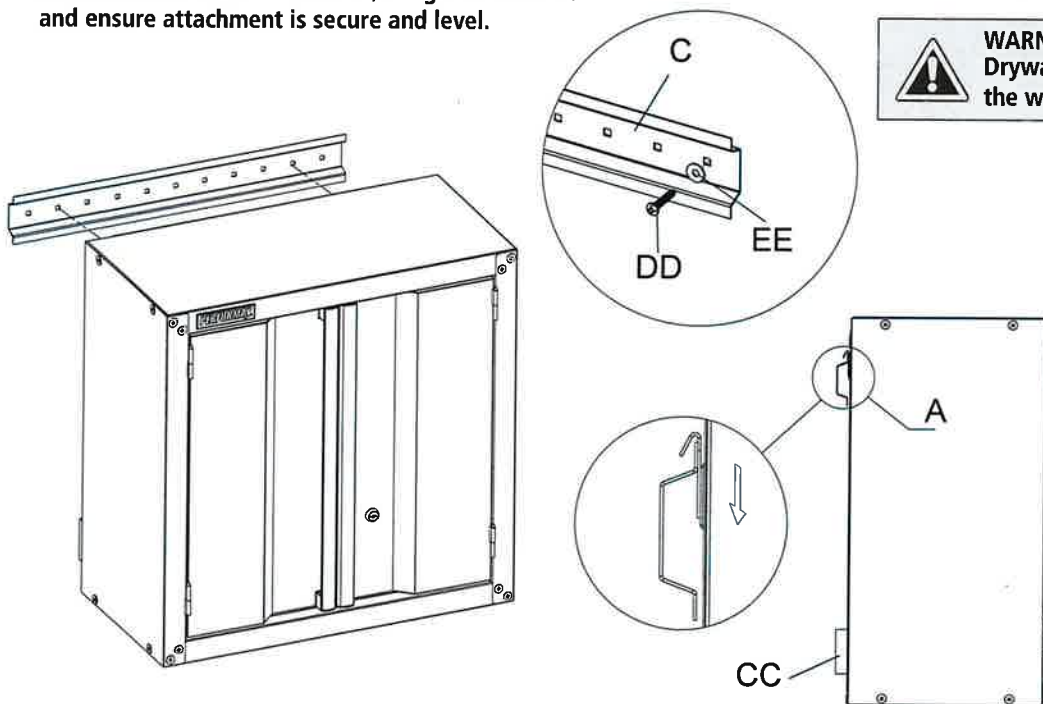
- Align the holes on the hinge of the Left Door (G) to the holes on the Side Panel.
- Repeat process for the Right Door (H with lock assembly).
- Once cabinet is square and level, go back and tighten all screws used in assembly.



7 Hanging Cabinet on Wood Frame Wall

When hanging the wall cabinet with supplied wall bracket, be sure the bracket is level and secured to a minimum of 2 wall studs with supplied fasteners. If attaching to masonry, use appropriate masonry fasteners. Failure to do so may cause the wall cabinet to fall.

- **Step 1: EVA assembly**
Peel off the paper back from the 2 EVA Bumpers (CC), and affix in the appropriate position toward bottom of Wall Cabinet back.
NOTE: Wall cabinet may need to be hung in the desired location to determine the appropriate position for EVA.
- **Step 2 Attaching Wall bracket**
Measure and mark the location of the holes on the wall into a minimum of 2 wall studs.
Ensure the bracket is level.
Use the ST6.3x75 Screws (DD) and Washers (EE) to attached Bracket (C) into the wall studs.
- **Step 3: Hang Wall Cabinet**
Once the Wall bracket is secure, hang Wall Cabinet and ensure attachment is secure and level.

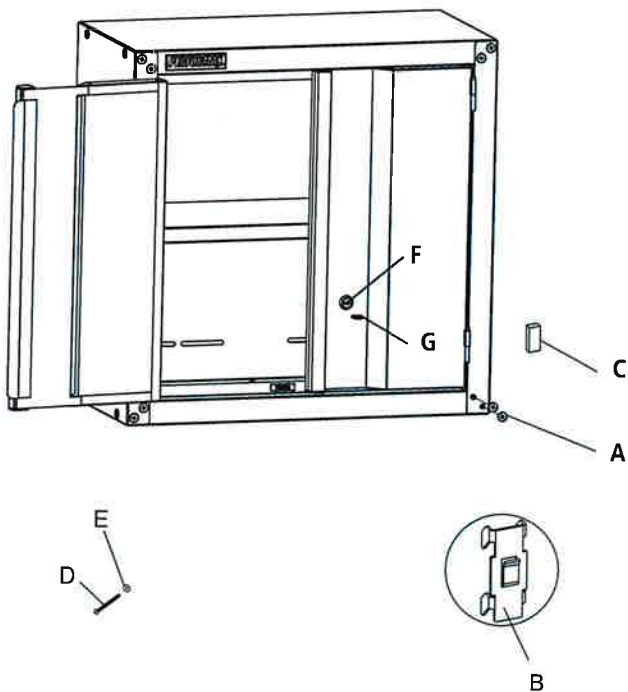

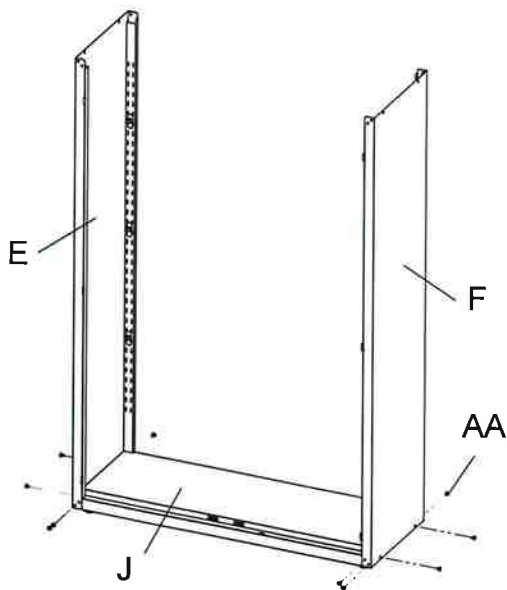
2 Attaching the Leveling Feet

- Attach the Leveling Feet (CC) to Bottom Panel (J) and tighten.



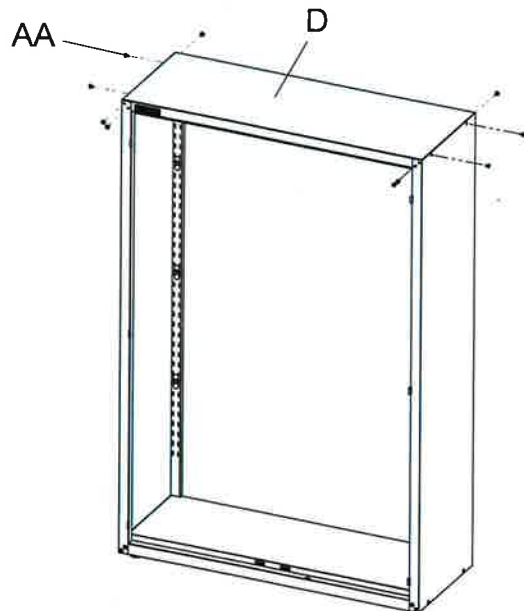
3 Attaching the Side Panels

- Attach Left Side Panel (E) and Right Side Panel (F) to Bottom Panel (J) with 10 screws (AA).
- Do not fully tighten.



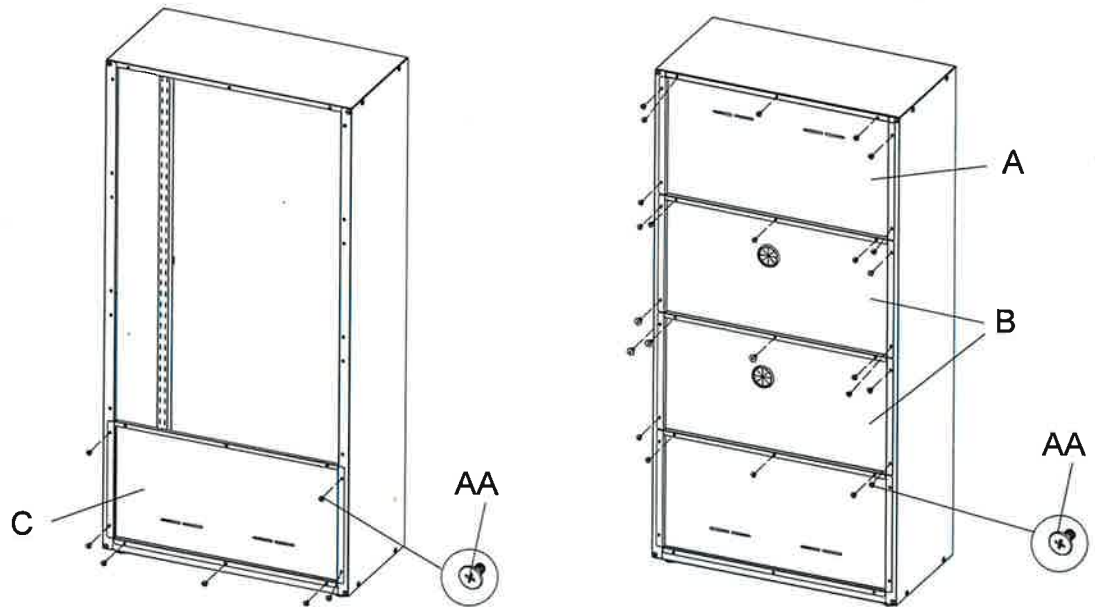
4 Attaching the Top Panel

- Attach Top Panel (D) to the Side Panels (E) and (F). Align holes on the sides and back and secure with 10 screws (AA).
- Do not fully tighten.



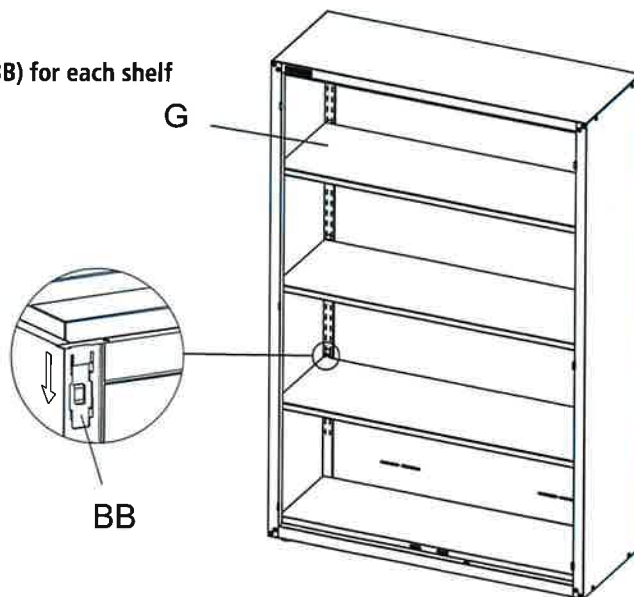
5 Attaching Back Panel

- Attach Back Panel-Top (A) inside the two side panels and bottom. Align and insert 10 screws (AA) into holes but do not fully tighten.



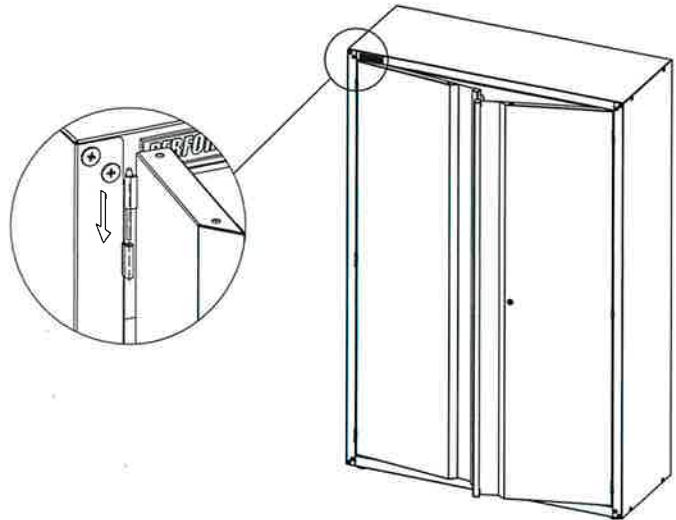

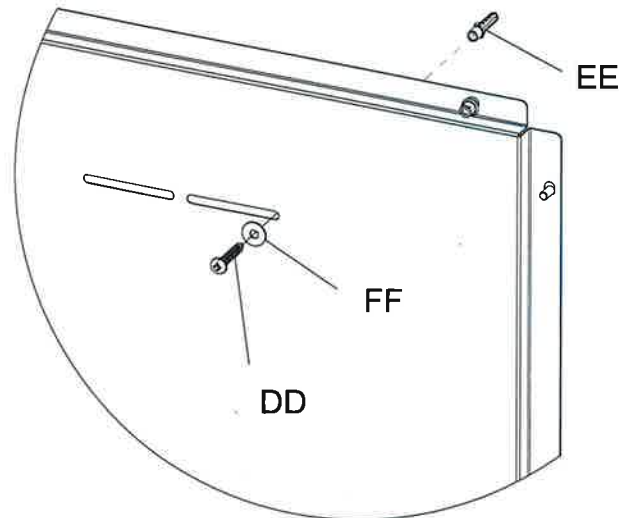
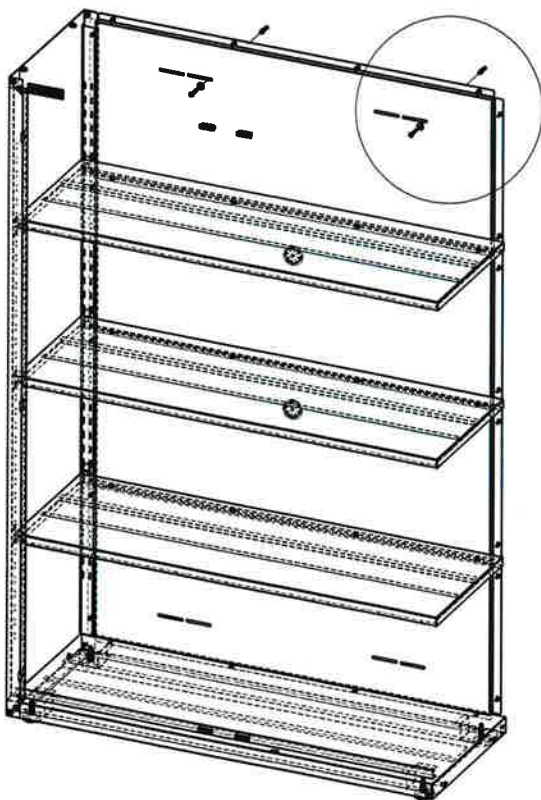
7 Attaching the door

- Align the holes on the hinge of the Left Door (H) to the holes on the Side Panel.
 - Repeat process for the right door (I with lock assembly).

- Once cabinet is square and level, go back and tighten all screws used in assembly.



8 Securing to a Wall

- Measure and mark the location of the left and right attachment holes on the wall.
- Drill a 5/16" hole on the left and right side and insert the Drywall Anchor (EE) into the holes. Use the ST6.3x75 screw (DD) and washer (FF) to secure each side of the the Back Panel (A) into the Drywall Anchor (EE).

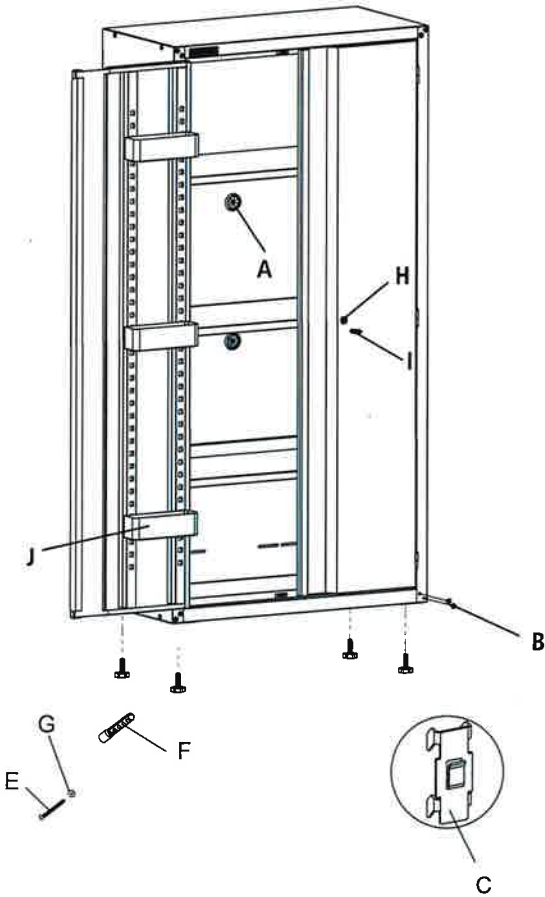
