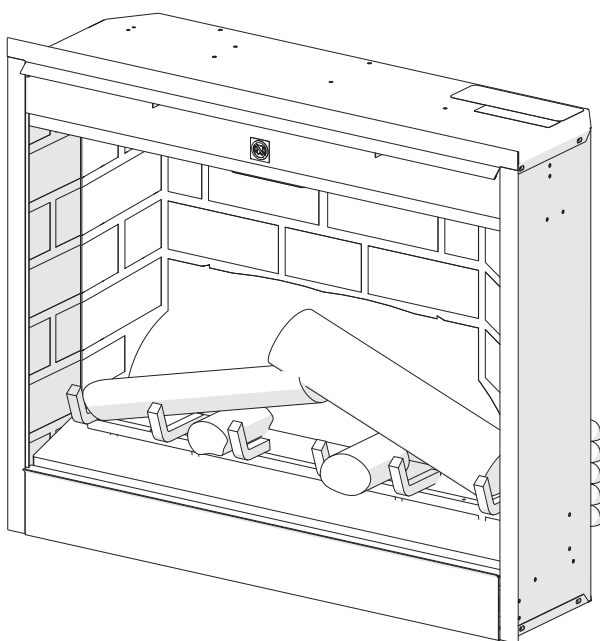

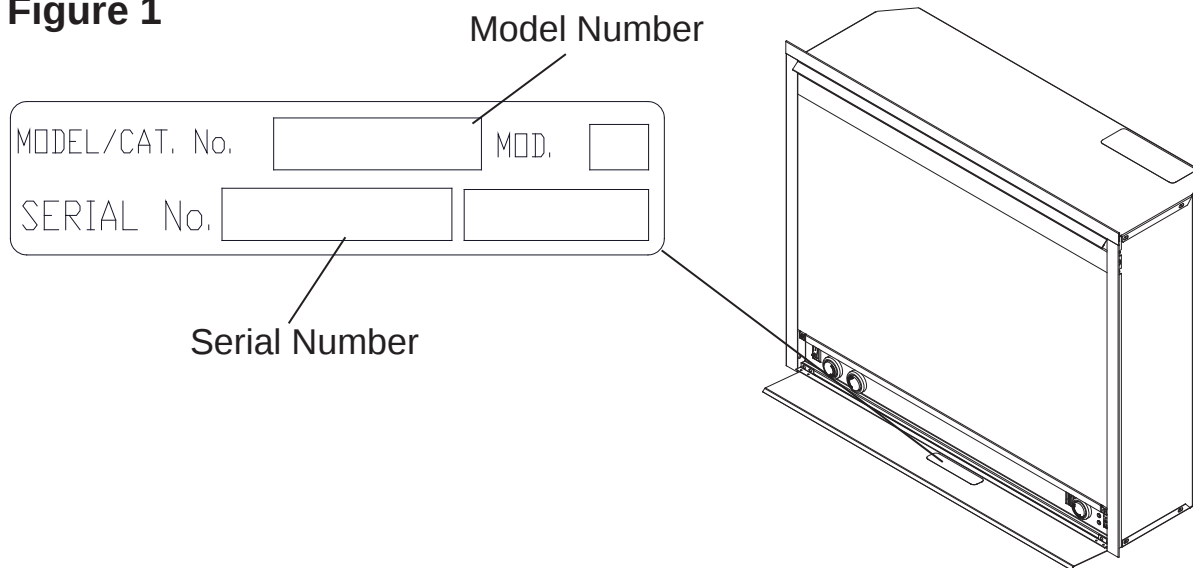

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

When using electrical appliances, basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

- ① Read all instructions before using this appliance.
- ② This fireplace is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not let bare skin touch hot surfaces. The trim around the heater outlet becomes hot during heater operation. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, and curtains at least 0.9 m (3 feet) from the front of the unit.
- ③ Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or invalids and whenever the unit is left operating and unattended.
- ④ Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- ⑤ This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- ⑥ The appliance must be positioned so that the plug is accessible.
- ⑦ Always unplug the electric fireplace when not in use.
- ⑧ If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, or its service agent, or a qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- ⑨ Do not operate any unit with a damaged cord or plug, or if the heater has malfunctioned, or if the electric fireplace has been dropped or damaged in any manner. Return heater to authorized service facility for examination, electrical or mechanical adjustment, or repair.
- ⑩ Do not use outdoors.
- ⑪ Do not use this fireplace in the immediate surroundings of a bath, a shower or a swimming pool.
- ⑫ Do not install the fireplace directly on carpet or a similar surface which may restrict air circulation beneath the unit.
- ⑬ Do not run the cord under carpeting. Do not cover cord with throw rugs, runners, or the like. Arrange cord away from traffic area and where it will not be tripped over.
- ⑭ Do not locate the heater immediately below a fixed socket-outlet.
- ⑮ Do not locate the appliance in front of a fixed socket-outlet.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- ⑩ To disconnect the fireplace, turn the controls off, then remove the plug from the outlet.
 - ⑪ Do not insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire, or damage to the heater.
 - ⑫ To prevent a possible fire, do not block air intake or exhaust in any manner. Do not use on soft surfaces, like a bed, where openings may become blocked.
 - ⑬ All electrical heaters have hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. Do not use in areas where gasoline, paint, or flammable liquids are used or stored or where the unit will be exposed to flammable vapors.
 - ⑭ Do not modify the electric fireplace. Use it only as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock or injury to persons.
 - ⑮ Avoid the use of an extension cord. Extension cords may overheat and cause a risk of fire. If you must use an extension cord, the cord must be 3-core type and have a rating no less than 10 Amps.
 - ⑯ Do not burn wood or other materials in the electric fireplace.
 - ⑰ Do not strike the fireplace glass.
 - ⑱ Always use a certified electrician should new circuits or outlets be required.
 - ⑲ Always use properly grounded and fused outlets.
 - ⑳ Disconnect all power supply before performing any cleaning, maintenance or relocation of the unit.
 - ㉑ When transporting or storing the unit and cord, keep in a dry place, free from excessive vibration and store so as to avoid damage.
-  **WARNING:** In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the heater

Site Selection and Preparation

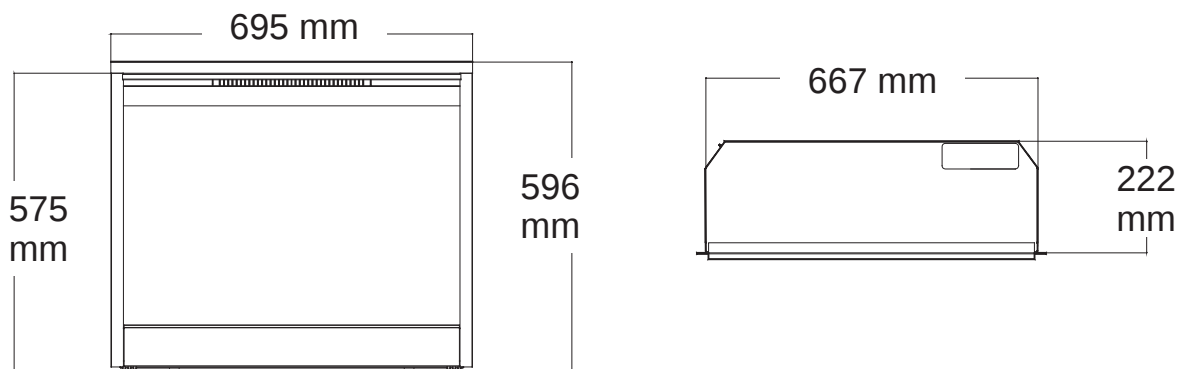
This section provides instructions for selecting a location and preparing the site to install the fireplace into your Dimplex mantel surround.

1. Select a suitable location that is not susceptible to moisture and is away from drapes, furniture and high traffic.
2. For ease of electrical hook up you may wish to locate the fireplace near an existing outlet (refer to NOTE 1).
3. Store the fireplace in a safe, dry and dust free location.

⚠ CAUTION: Clearance for air circulation beneath the fireplace is provided by two spacers. **DO NOT INSTALL FIREPLACE DIRECTLY ON CARPET OR SIMILAR SURFACES WHICH MAY RESTRICT AIR CIRCULATION.** If installing the fireplace in a carpeted area, place a one-piece, solid flat surface under the fireplace. Ensure that all feet rest securely on this surface.

! NOTE: The dimensions of the fireplace are 667 mm wide X 575 mm high X 222 mm deep. The fireplace does not require any additional venting. With trim, the dimensions are 695 mm wide X 596 mm high X 222 mm deep.

Fireplace Installation

⚡ WARNING: Ensure the power cord is not installed so that it is pinched or against a sharp edge and ensure that the power cord is stored or secured to avoid tripping or snagging to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons.

Construction and electrical outlet wiring must comply with local building codes and other applicable regulations to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons.

Do not attempt to wire your own new outlets or circuits. To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons,

always use a licensed electrician.

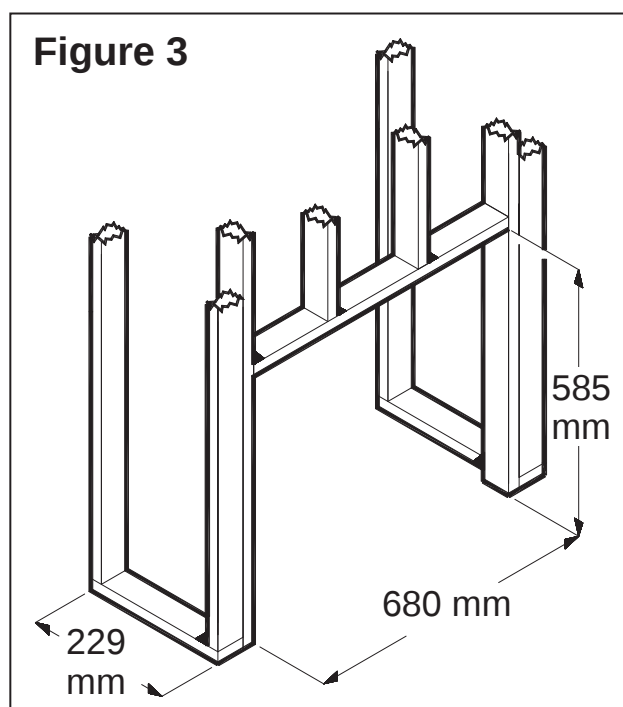
Install the fireplace assembly into the mantel (refer to mantel assembly instructions).

! **NOTE:** A 10 Amp, 240 Volt circuit is required. A dedicated circuit is preferred but not essential in all cases. A dedicated circuit will be required if after installation the circuit breaker trips or fuse blows on a regular basis when the heater is operating. Additional appliances on the same circuit may exceed the current rating of the circuit breaker.

! **IMPORTANT:** If not using a Dimplex mantel, the fireplace must be installed in an enclosure with the following **MINIMUM** dimensions(Figure 3).

New Wall Construction

1. Select a suitable location that is not susceptible to moisture and is away from drapes, furniture and high traffic.
2. Place the fireplace in the desired location to see how it will look in the room.
3. Mark the desired location on the floor.

4. Use studs to frame an opening of 680 mm wide X 585 mm high X 229 mm deep.

Option #1

The power cord can be run from behind the trim and along the wall to an outlet near the fireplace.

Option #2

A new outlet can be installed inside the framing construction. Plug the fireplace into a 10 Amp/240 Volt outlet. If the cord does not reach you may use a 3-core type extension cord rated for a minimum of 10 Amps.

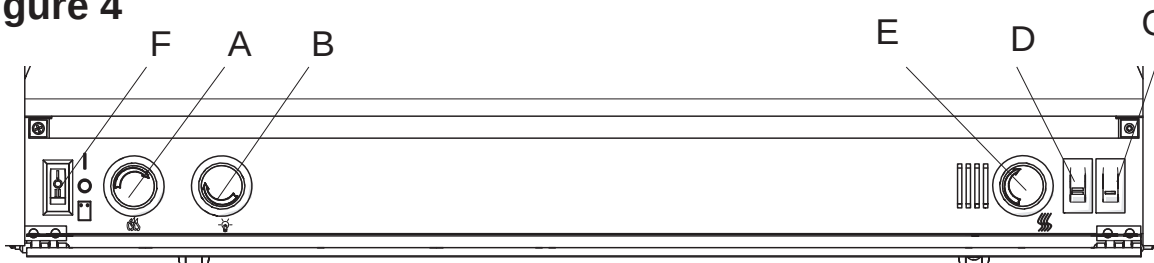
Existing Fireplace:

1. Seal all drafts and vents with a non-fibrous insulation material to prevent any chimney debris from falling onto the fireplace. Do not install into an existing fireplace that is prone to dampness.
2. Cap the top of the chimney flue to prevent rain from entering.
3. Plan your electric power supply.
4. The power cord can run along the front of the hearth to an outlet near the fireplace.

⚠ CAUTION: Clearance for air circulation beneath the fireplace insert is provided by two spacers. **Do not install the fireplace insert directly on carpet or similar surfaces which may restrict air circulation.** If installing the fireplace in a carpeted area, place a one-piece, solid, flat surface under the fireplace insert. Ensure that all three of the insert's feet rest securely on this surface.

Manual Control

The manual controls for the fireplace are behind the access panel located at the bottom of the fireplace (Figure 4).

A. Flame Action Control

Turn the flame action control knob to adjust the flame speed to the desired level.

B. Interior Light Control

Turn the interior light control knob to increase or decrease the brightness of the interior light.

C. Level 1 Heat

Provides heat output from one element.

D. Level 2 Heat

Provides heat output from both elements.

! **NOTE:** This switch must be in the ON (I) position for heater to operate with or without heat.

E. Heater Thermostat Control

To adjust the temperature to your individual requirements, turn the

thermostat control clockwise all the way to turn on the heater. When the room reaches the desired temperature, turn the thermostat knob counter clockwise until you hear a click. Leave in this position to maintain the room temperature at its setting. For additional heat, turn clockwise until you hear the click again and the heater will turn on. To turn the heater off, rotate the knob fully counter clockwise.

F. Main Three Position Switch

The switch has two ON positions marked with  and "I". The "I" position is for manual operation. In this position the built-in remote control is by-passed.

The  position is for operating the unit with the provided remote control.

When in  position, the unit is operated with the ON and OFF buttons of the remote control.

When the switch is in the center

position the unit is off.

Resetting the Temperature Cut-off Switch

This unit is equipped with a thermostat which controls the temperature of the room by turning the heater on and off. The heater is protected with a safety device to prevent overheating. Should the heater overheat, an automatic cut out will turn the heater off and it will not come back on without being reset. It can be reset by switching the Main Switch to "O" and waiting 5 minutes before switching the unit back on.

⚠ CAUTION: If you need to continuously reset the heater, unplug the unit and call customer service. Please have your model and serial number ready when calling.

! **NOTE:** The heater may emit a slight, harmless odor when first used. This odor is a normal condition caused by initial heating of internal heater parts and will not occur again.

Remote Control (Figure 5)

The fireplace is supplied with an integrated on/off remote control. Where the maximum range of use is ~5m.

⚡ WARNING: It takes time for the receiver to respond to the transmitter. Do not press the buttons more than once within two seconds for correct operation.

! **NOTE:** Ensure that the fireplace 3 position switch is set to the remote control setting (up position).

To operate, push the ON button to turn fireplace on, push the OFF button to turn the fireplace off.

Battery Replacement

To replace the battery:

1. Slide battery cover open on the back of the remote control.
2. Install AAA batteries into the remote control.
3. Replace the battery cover.

Discard leaky batteries. Dispose

of batteries in the proper manner according to provincial and local regulations. Any battery may leak electrolyte if mixed with a different battery type, if inserted incorrectly, if all the batteries are not replaced at the same time, if disposed of in

a fire, or if an attempt is made to charge a battery not intended to be recharged.

Maintenance

 **WARNING:** Disconnect the power before attempting any maintenance or cleaning to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or damage to persons.

Light Bulb Replacement

Allow at least five minutes for the light bulbs to cool before touching them to avoid accidental burning of the skin. The light bulbs need to be replaced when you notice a dark section of the flame or when the clarity and detail of the log ember bed exterior reduces. There are three bulbs under the log set, which generate the flames and embers, and two bulbs above the log that illuminate the log exterior.

Lower Light Bulb Requirements

Quantity of three clear chandelier or candelabra bulbs with an

E-14 (small) socket base, 60 Watt rating. **Do not exceed 60 Watts per bulb**

Helpful Hints: It is a good idea to replace all light bulbs at one time if they are close to the end of their rated life. Group replacement will reduce the number of times you need to open the unit to replace light bulbs. Care must be taken when removing the log set as the log set contains LED's and wires.

To access the lower light bulb area:

1. Slide fireplace out of mantel.
2. Lay unit on its back for safe removal of front glass.
3. Remove four Phillips screws from the right side of trim.
4. Remove trim.
5. Slide glass to right side of

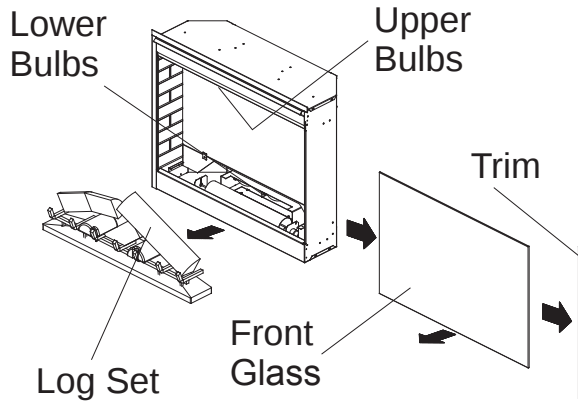
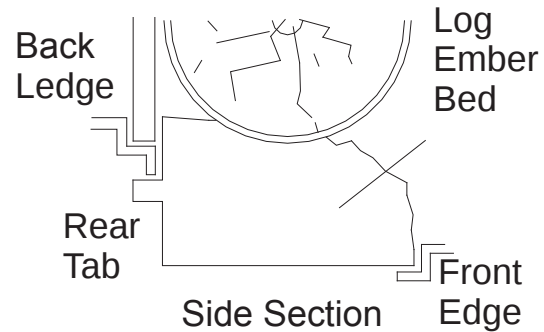

fireplace to remove (Figure 6).

6. Pull the front edge of the plastic ember bed or plastic grate up and forward until the rear tab releases from the ledge located at the bottom of the mirror (Figure 7).
7. Remove flicker rod by sliding flicker rod to the left away from the flicker motor and lifting out.
8. Remove light bracket for easier access to light bulbs.
 - ! **IMPORTANT:** Only handle the log set by the ember bed.
 - ! **NOTE:** Log set fits tightly into firebox, some force may be necessary to remove.
9. Set log set in front of fireplace.

10. Unscrew bulbs counter clockwise.

11. Insert new bulbs.
12. Replace the log set by inserting the front edge of the fireplace and push down on the rear edge of the ember bed until it snaps into place (Figure 7).
13. Lay unit on it's back and slide front glass back into position and attach trim.

! **NOTE:** Ensure the log set is installed tightly under the back ledge to prevent light leakage.

Upper Light Bulb Requirements

Quantity of two (2) clear chandelier or candelabra bulbs with an E-14 (small socket base, 25 Watt rating). **Do not exceed 25 Watts per bulb**



Maintenance

To access the upper light bulb area:

1. Slide fireplace out of mantel
2. Lay unit on it's back for safe removal of front glass.
3. Remove four Phillips screws from right side of trim.
4. Remove trim.
5. Slide glass to the right side of the fireplace to remove (Figure 6).
6. Upper bulbs located in the upper left and upper right corners of fireplace.
7. Remove upper light block by removing the four (4) mounting screws.
8. Unscrew bulbs counter clockwise.
9. Insert new bulbs.
10. Re-install upper light bracket.
11. Lay unit on it's back slide front glass back into position and attach trim.

Glass Cleaning

The glass is cleaned in the factory during the assembly operation. During shipment, installation, handling, etc., the glass may collect dust particles; these can be removed by dusting lightly with a

clean dry cloth.

To remove fingerprints or other marks, the glass can be cleaned with a damp cloth. To prevent scratching, do not use abrasive cleaners or spray liquids on the any surface.

Fireplace Surface Cleaning

Use a cloth dampened with warm water only to clean painted surfaces of the electric fireplace. Do not use abrasive cleaners.

Warranty

Dimplex Electric Fireplaces are tested and inspected prior to shipment and are guaranteed from defect to the purchaser of each new product. Any part which proves to be defective in material or workmanship under normal use within one year will be repaired or replaced without charge.* The Company will not be responsible for any expense incurred for installation, removal for service, or transportation costs. Any such defect should be brought to the attention of the Dealer where the product was purchased and is authorized to repair or replace within the terms of this warranty.

The Company's only obligation under this warranty will be at its sole option to repair or replace any part proving defective or to refund the purchase price thereof.

The owner/user assumes all other risks, if any, including the risk of any direct, indirect or consequential loss or damage arising out of the use of or inability to use the product.

The warranty will not apply if, in the sole judgment of the Company, damage or failure has resulted from accident, alteration, misuse, abuse, incorrect installation, or operation on an incorrect power source.

The foregoing is in lieu of all other warranties expressed, implied, or statutory, and the Company neither assumes, nor authorizes any

person to assume for it any other obligation, or liability in connection with said product.

*Light bulbs are not covered in the warranty.
