BUTTON	FUNCTION
	Power / Play / Pause / TWS Button : Press and hold to turn the speaker on or off. Press once to play or pause audio. Double press to activate TWS pairing mode.
	RGB Lighting Button : Press and hold to turn the RGB lighting on or off. Press once to cycle through the available RGB lighting modes.
	Volume Down / Previous Track Button : Press once to skip to the previous track. Press and hold to decrease the volume.
	Volume Up / Next Track Button : Press once to skip to the next track. Press and hold to increase the volume.
