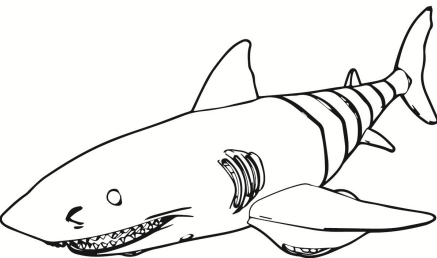


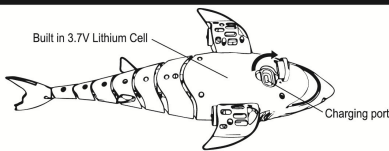

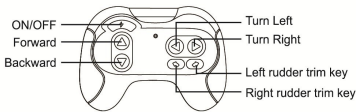

<RC TOY'S DETAILS>

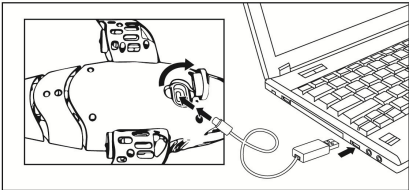


<REMOTE CONTROL FUNCTIONS>



< CHARGE INSTRUCTION >

1. Plug the USB cable into a 5V power source (e.g. PC, phone charger, power bank) with maximum 2A output.
2. Plug the charging cable into the port in the back of the vehicle.

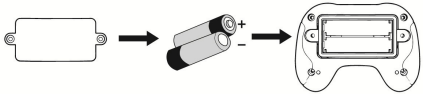


Warm Notice:

1. Do not charge the battery immediately after use, let's the battery cool for at least 10 minutes.
2. The charging indicator will light up during charging and light will turn off when finishing charging.

<BATTERY INSTALLATION>

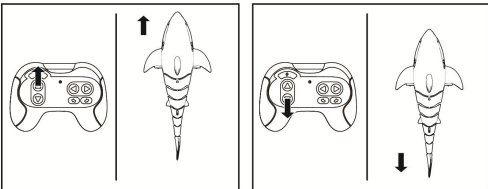


1. Open the battery cover.
2. Install 2x1.5V AAA batteries (not included) in the correct positive (+) and negative (-) polarity direction.
3. Close the battery cover.

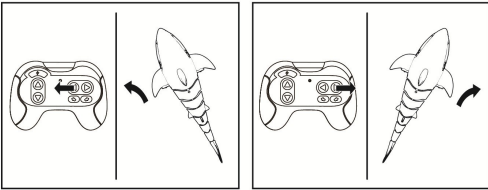
Notice: If the remote control will not be used for a long time, please make sure to take out the batteries.

<OPERATION>

1. Forward and Backward



2. Turn Left and Turn Right



When the shark's battery is low, the lights on the eyes will flash.

<NOTE>

1. The motor will rotate only when the product is put into water, not when held in the hand.
2. Please play on the water.
3. Adult supervision recommended at all times.
4. Remove all batteries when not using it for a long period of time.

<HOW TO REMOVE OR PLACE THE BATTERY>

- Non-rechargeable batteries cannot be charged.
- The battery is charged by children 8 years of age and older.
- Different types of batteries or new and old ones should not be mixed.
- The battery should be inserted with the correct polarity.
- Used-up batteries should be removed from the toys.
- The power terminals must not be short-circuited.

<TROUBLE SHOOTING>

PROBLEM	SOLUTION
Motor does not run	1. Power switch is off please turn on. 2. Battery exhausted, please charge. 3. Re-frequency.
Suddenly stopped during operation	1. Check if the battery is electrical. 2. Replace or recharge the battery.
Remote control Power indicator flashing	Replace the battery.
Driving becomes slow	Recharge the battery.
