

User Manual



- 1、 The left button controls the light's on and off, while the right button cycles through color temperature shortcuts: 3000K–5000K–6500K.

- 2、 These two buttons represent color temperature, indicating a decrease and an increase in color temperature respectively.

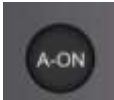
- 3、 , These two buttons represent the power of the lamp, allowing you to adjust the increase and decrease of the power respectively.

- 4、 Press this button, regardless of whether the lamp is on or off, when you press the button, the lamp will return to its maximum power and the highest color temperature.

- 5、 These three buttons: 1H indicates that the light will automatically turn off after 1 hour of the set time; 4H means it will turn off after 4 hours of the set time; 8H means it will turn off after 8 hours of the set time.

- 6、 These two indicate the cancellation of functions.

- 7、 Pairing: Press and hold for a long time before powering on.  ; Disassembly: Press and

hold for a long time before powering on.
