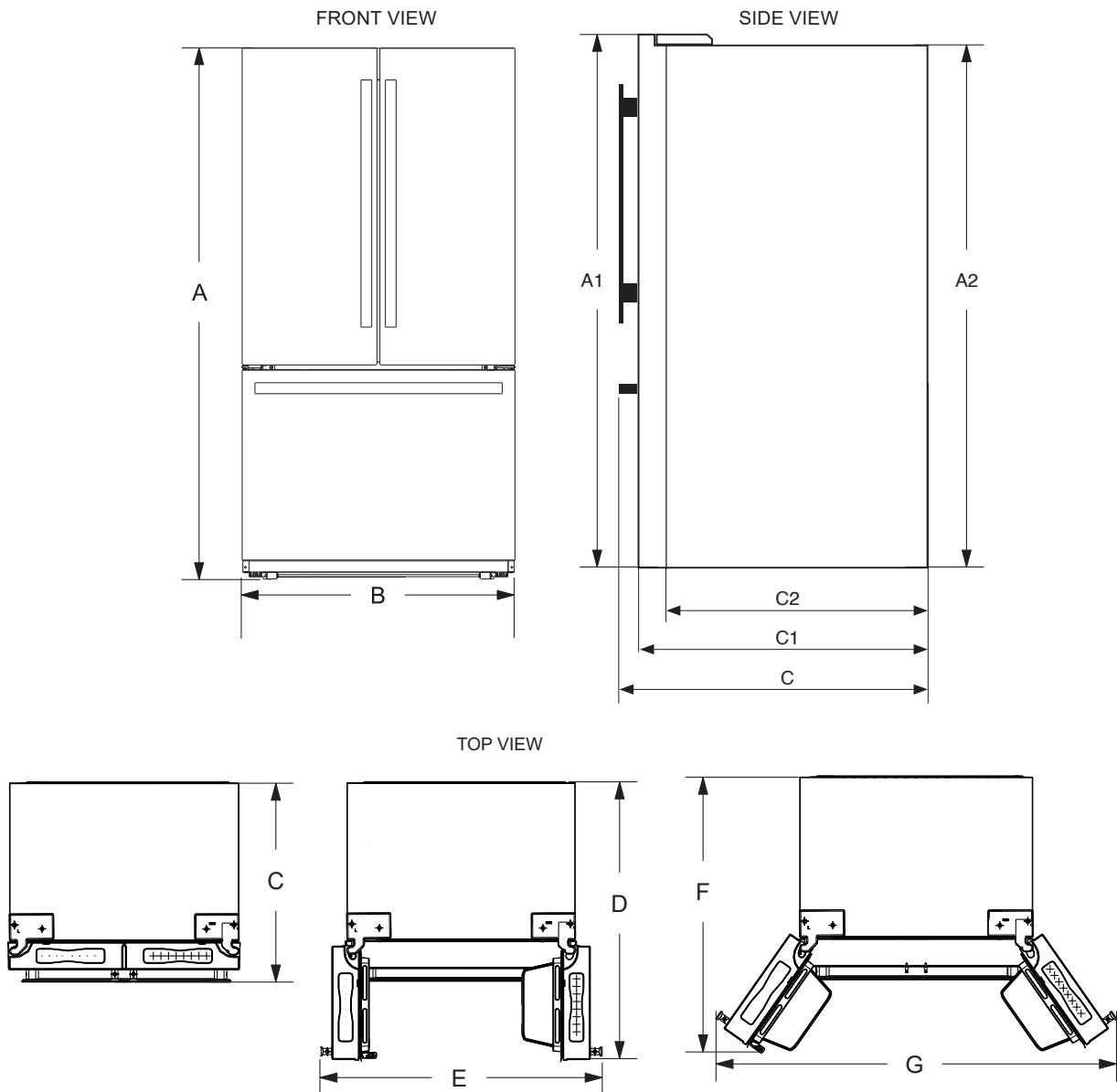

⚠ WARNING

Precaution before installation:

Before installation or adjusting of accessories, it shall be ensured that the refrigerator is disconnected from power.

Precautions shall be taken to ensure that the handle has been securely attached in order to prevent personal injury when opening the door.

INSTALLATION LOCATION

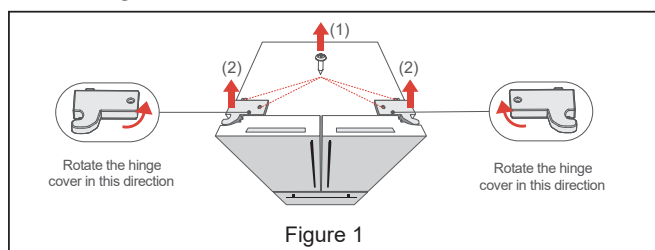
- This refrigerator is designed for indoor, household use only.
- Keep away from heat and avoid direct sunlight or places near a heat source, such as an oven or a radiator.
- Do not place the refrigerator in moist or damp places to prevent rust or reduction of its insulating function of the electrical components and food storage compartments.
- The refrigerator should be placed in a dry and well-ventilated indoor place.
- The ground shall be level, and sturdy (rotate the adjustable leg left or right to adjust for leveling if unstable).
- The ambient temperature of the appliance's location should range from a minimum of 55°F to a maximum of 110°F. However, for better energy usage and superior cooling, the temperature is recommended to be between 60°F and 90°F.
- For proper air circulation and electric connections, 4" of clearance from each adjacent wall and the ceiling is recommended when installing the refrigerator. If not available, minimum 2" of clearance is strongly recommended.
- Spare enough space for convenient opening of the doors and drawers, especially when the refrigerator is installed next to a fixed wall to allow the door to swing open.

DISASSEMBLY OF REFRIGERATOR DOORS/DRAWERS

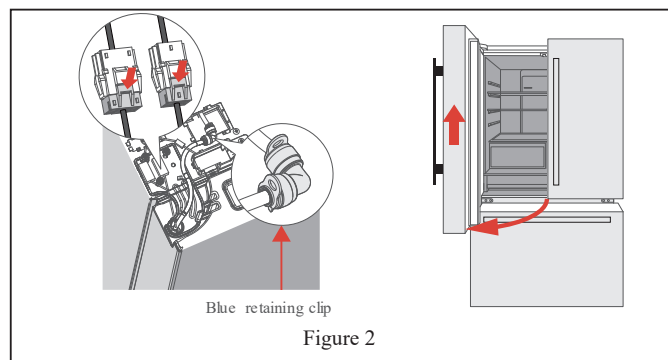
In some cases you need to remove the fridge doors and drawer doors to move the refrigerator through a doorway. The doors can be removed by the following steps. IF NOT NECESSARY, DO NOT REMOVE THOSE DOORS.

DISASSEMBLY OF REFRIGERATOR DOORS

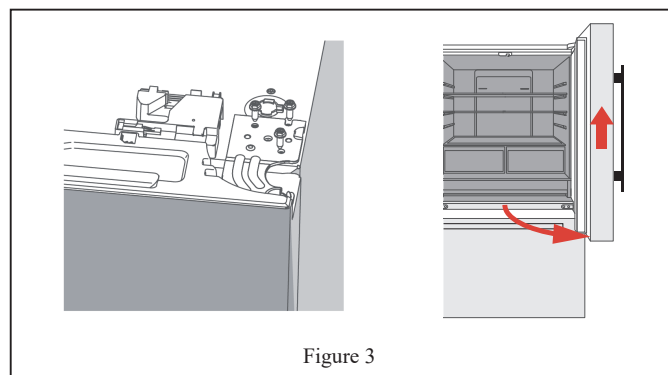
- 1 A. Remove the 4 screws from the top hinge cover.
B. The hinge cover and hinge are fixed with clips. Rotate the hinge cover in the direction of the arrow and lift it up. See Figure 1.



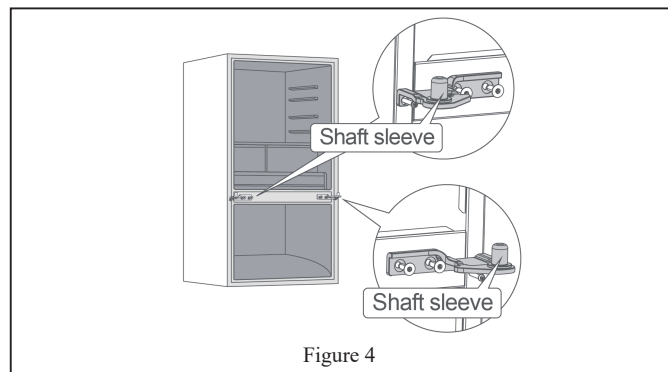
- 2 A. Disconnect the 2 harness quick connectors by pressing the position indicated by the arrow shown in the right figure.
B. Pull out the blue retaining clip from the quick release one way valve, press the gray plastic ring. Remove the door water line.
C. Remove the 3 screws with socket wrench set from the product.
D. Open the left door 90°, lift it up, then remove the door from the product. See Figure 2.



- 3 A. Remove the 3 screws with socket wrench set from the product.
B. Open the right door 90°, lift it up, then remove the door from the product. See Figure 3.



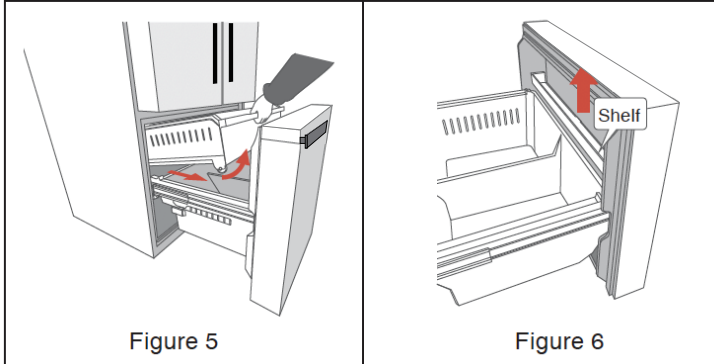
- 4 Remove the middle hinge with allen wrench and phillips screwdriver from the product. Note: When the width of the door is less than 32 inches, remove the middle hinge. When the width of the door is more than 32 inches, don't remove middle hinge. See Figure 4.



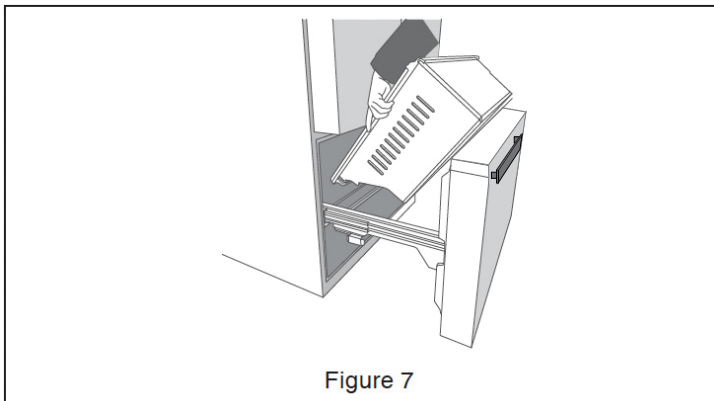

DISASSEMBLY OF FREEZER DRAWER

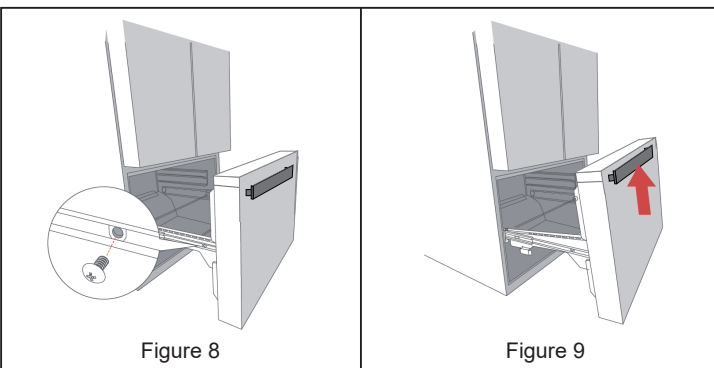
- 1 Fully open freezer door, take out the upper drawer. Operating instructions: Pull the drawer out for a distance, and then rotate it upwards to take it out. See Figure 5.
- 2 Move up and take out the shelf. See figure 6.



- 3 Take out the lower drawer. Operating instructions: Pull the drawer out for a distance, move it up, then rotate it upwards and take it out. See Figure 7.

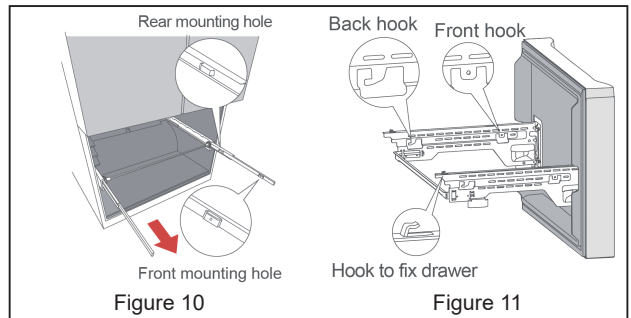


- 4 Use a crosshead screwdriver to remove the two screws that fix the supporters and rails. Note: Do not discard the screws, which need to be reinstalled when reattaching the freezer door. See Figure 8.
- 5 Rotate the freezer door upwards and take it out. See Figure 9.

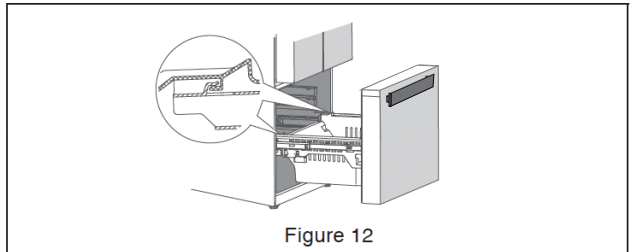


FREEZER DOOR ASSEMBLY

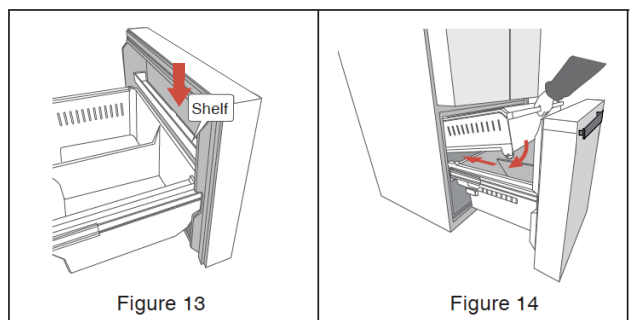
- 1 Fully open the rails. See Figure 10. Gently pick up the freezer door and insert the hooks of supporters into the holes of rails. See Figure 11.



- 2 Reattach the two screws. See Figure 8. Insert the lower drawer back into its position. Note: the lower drawer should be inserted into the supporter's hooks on both sides. See Figure 12.



- 3 Insert the shelf back into its position. See Figure 13. Insert the upper drawer back into its position. Note: the front wheel should be inside the side wall of the lower drawer. See Figure 14.

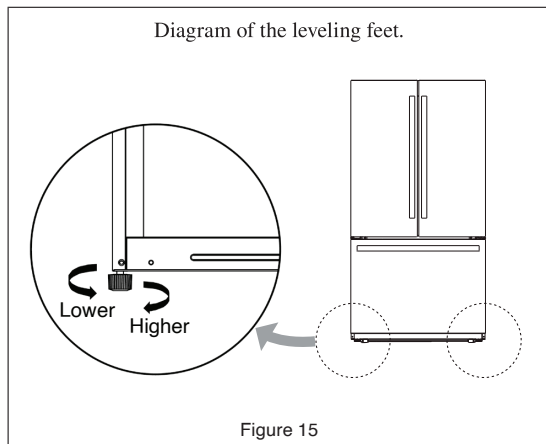
- Be careful not to scratch or dent the rail assembly.
- Make sure you mount the freezer baskets in the correct position.

LEVELING THE REFRIGERATOR

Precautions before operation

- 1 Before operation of accessories, it shall be ensured that the refrigerator is disconnected from power source. Before adjusting the leveling feet, precautions shall be taken to prevent any personal injury.
- 2 Adjusting procedures, see Figure 15:
 - A. Turn the feet counterclockwise to raise the refrigerator.
 - B. Turn the feet clockwise to lower the refrigerator.
 - C. Adjust the right and left feet based on the procedures above to a horizontal level.



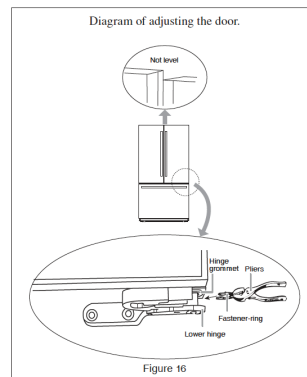
LEVELING THE DOORS

Precaution before operation

- 1 Before operation of accessories, it shall be ensured that the refrigerator is disconnected from power source. Before adjusting the door, precautions shall be taken to prevent any personal injury.
- 2 Raise the lower door up to the level of the higher door.
- 3 Insert the supplied fastener-rings by using pliers in the gap between the hinge-grommet and the lower hinge.

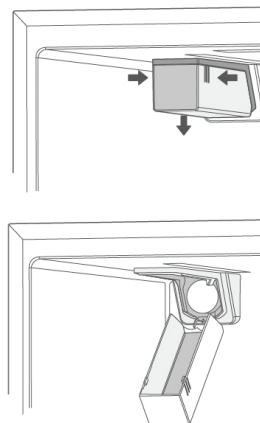
The number of fastener-rings you will need to insert depends on the gap. See Figure 16.

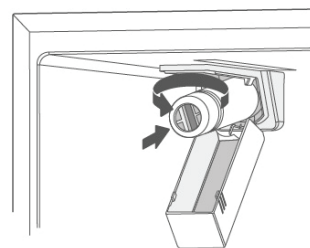


INSTALLING THE WATER FILTER

- 1 When using the refrigerator for the first time, press the marks on both sides of the filter cover by hand and open it downward. When closing, apply upward force, the filter cover position returning to its pre-open state indicates proper assembly.



- 2 Remove the outer package of the filter, rotate clockwise and press the filter element to install it at the refrigerator filter joint until it cannot be rotated anymore. Rotate counterclockwise to remove the filter element.



- 3 It is recommended to replace the filter once every six months.

Removing any residual matter inside the water line after installing the water filter

- After the water filter is replaced, dispense 2.5 gallons of water (flush for approximately 5 minutes) to remove trapped air and contaminants from the system.
- Additional flushing may be required in some households.
- Open the refrigerator door and make sure there are no water leaks coming from the water filter.

NOTE:

Do not dispense the entire 2.5 gallon amount continuously. Depress and release the dispenser pad for cycles of 30 seconds ON and 60 seconds OFF.

CONNECTING THE WATER LINE

WATER CONNECTION

⚠ WARNING

Risk of electric shock and damage to the appliance:

- Disconnect the appliance from the power source before performing any work on the water connection.
- Only a qualified installation technician may connect the appliance to the water supply in accordance with plumbing and relevant water utility company regulations.

Connect the appliance to a drinking water line only:

- Minimum pressure: 0.28 MPa (2.76 bar, 40psi)
- Maximum pressure: 0.69 MPa (6.89 bar, 100psi)
- Pressure over 0.69 MPa (6.89 bar, 100 psi): install a pressure limiter between drinking water connection and hose set.

The water supply should be connected only by a competent plumber according to the local regulations of the appropriate water supply company.

A cold water connection is necessary for operating the ice maker. The water pressure must be between 0.28 MPa (2.76 bar, 40 psi) and 0.69 MPa (6.89 bar, 100 psi).

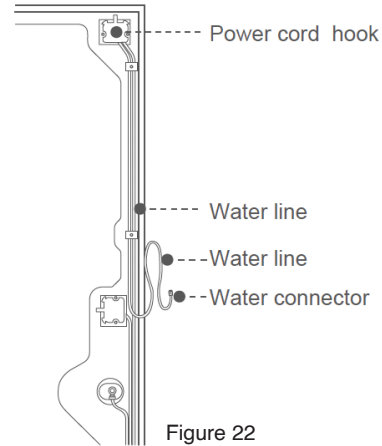
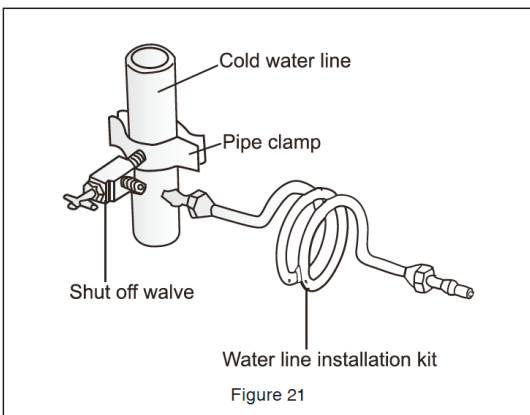
The installation must correspond to the local plumbing regulations.

A separate shut-off valve should be installed in the cold-water inflow.

The shut-off valve should not be located behind the appliance. It is recommended that you mount the shut-off valve directly next to the appliance or at another place that is easily accessible. See Figures 21-22.

When installing the water connection, pay attention to the permissible installation area for the water line.

For connection to the drinking water line, use only water pipes that are suitable for drinking water. Observe local regulations and the connection conditions of the local water supply companies.



Connecting the Water Line to A Drinkable Water Source

If your water line is not drinkable, please add an external water filter.

If you must repair or disassemble the water line, cut off the plastic tubing to make sure you get a snug, leak-free connection.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

CONNECTING THE WATER LINE

Water line installation kits are available as an additional accessory from your dealer or at a local hardware store.

- 1 Shut off the main water supply line.
- 2 Install a shut-off valve and water line 1/4" x 1/4" compression thread (UNS 7/16-24), accessible with product in place. Refer to local code and instructions with water line installation kit (not included)
- 3 Connect the newly installed water supply line (B) to the refrigerator water inlet connector (A), tighten using tool. See Figure 24.
- 4 Gently tug on the water supply line to ensure a proper fit and risk of damage when pulling or pushing the unit for cleaning.
- 5 Turn main water back on and check for leaks.
- 6 After connecting the water line, please flush one gallon of water through the filter before drinking or using the water from your refrigerator. (Flush approximately 5 minutes.) To flush, press a large glass or cup against the water dispenser lever. Fill the glass, then empty it. Repeat until you dispense about one gallon of water.

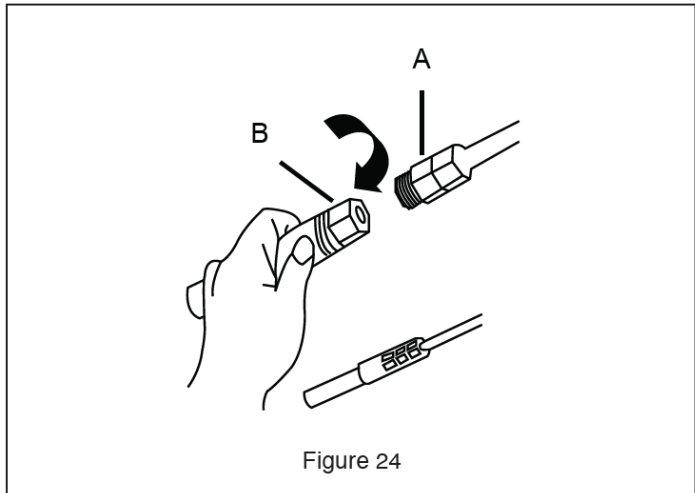

INSTALLING DOOR HANDLES

Precautions shall be taken to prevent handle falling off and causing any personal injury.

INSTALLING PROCEDURES

- 1 Take out bolt 1 from accessory bag, then use Phillips screwdriver to secure the bolt 1 into the bolt hole 2 of refrigerator doors. See Figure 25.
- 2 Attach the handle of the door through the bolt hole 1 and make sure that the handle makes contact to the door surface closely. See Figure 26.
- 3 Attach the handle by rotating the handle screw 3 clockwise until it stops to the end, gently shake the handle to ensure it has been attached securely.
- 4 Put the screw hole cap 4 on the handle screw hole to complete this installation.

Note: The screw hole cap is not removable once applied.

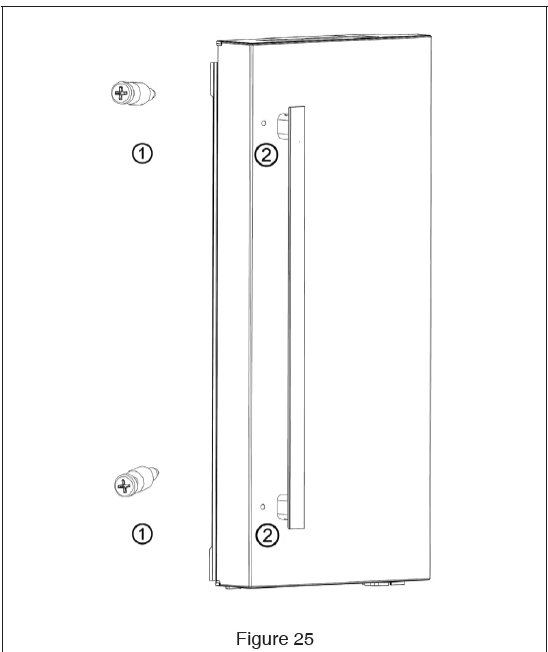

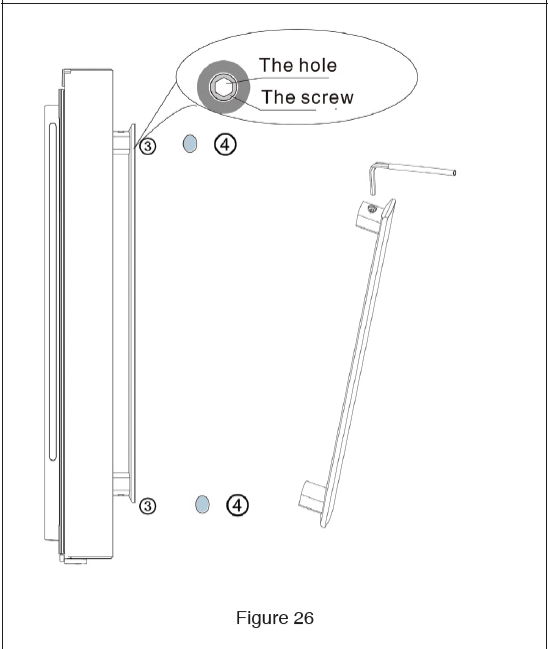

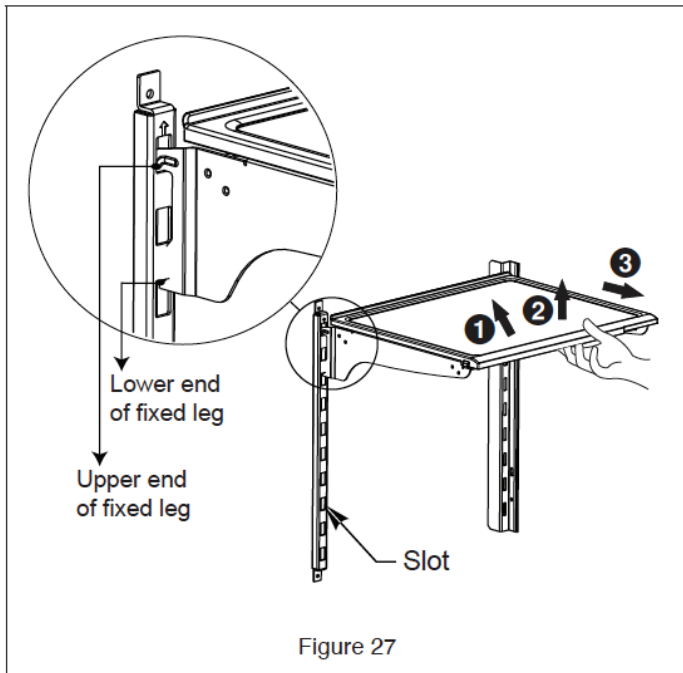

ADJUSTING THE SHELVES

The cantilever rack could be adjusted to the proper height as required by food.

- To adjust the cantilever rack please follow the arrows as show in Figure 27.
- Raise it upward first and then take it out by tilting it upward.
- During installation, put the upper end of the fixed leg into one of the upper slots on the supporting iron first and then put the lower end of the fixed leg into the third slot on the lower part of the supporting iron.



BEFORE USING THE REFRIGERATOR

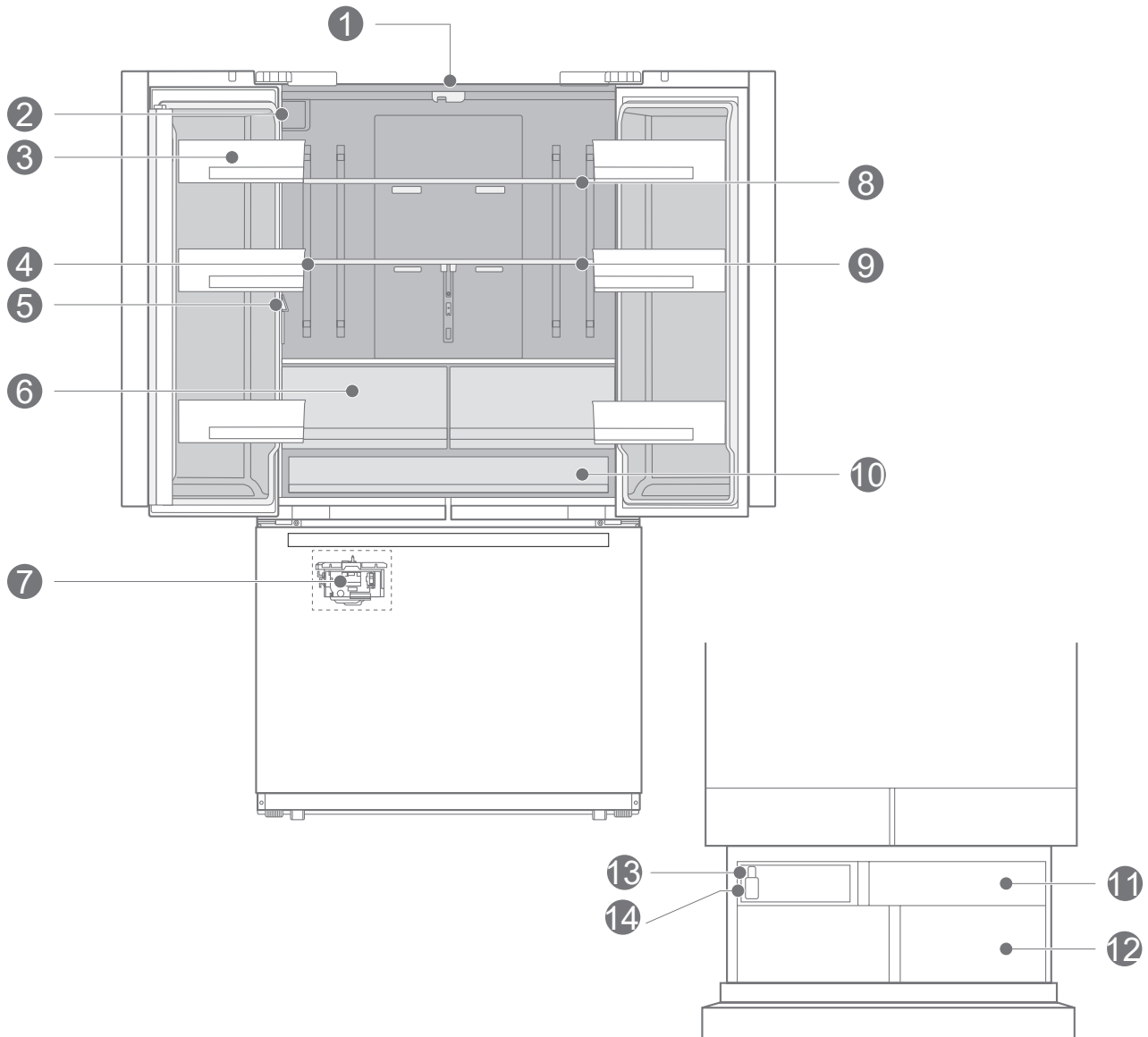
- Before use, remove all packaging materials, including bottom cushions, foam pads and tape inside of the refrigerator; tear off the protective film on the doors and the refrigerator body.
- Before turning the refrigerator on, keep the refrigerator still for 2 hours before connecting it to the power supply.
- Before putting any fresh or frozen foods, the refrigerator should have run for 2-3 hours or for about 4 hours in summer when the ambient temperature is high.

ENERGY SAVING TIPS

- The appliance should be located in the coolest area of the room, away from the heat producing appliances or heating ducts, and out of the direct sunlight.
- Let hot foods cool down to the room temperature before placing in the appliance. Overloading the appliance forces the compressor to run longer. Foods that freeze too slowly may lose quality or spoil.
- Be sure to wrap foods properly and wipe containers dry before placing them in the appliance. This cuts down on frost build-up inside the appliance.
- Appliance storage bin should not be lined with aluminum foil, wax paper or paper toweling. Liners interfere with cold air circulation, making the appliance less efficient.
- Organize and label food to reduce door openings and extended searches. Remove as many items as needed at one time, and close the door as soon as possible.

REFRIGERATOR

- The refrigerator is suitable for storage of a variety of fruits, vegetables, beverages, and other foods consumed in the short term.
- Cooked foods should not be put in the refrigerator until cooled down to the room temperature.
- Foods are recommended to be sealed in appropriate containers before placing inside the refrigerator.
- The glass shelves can be adjusted up or down for a desired storage space and ease of use.

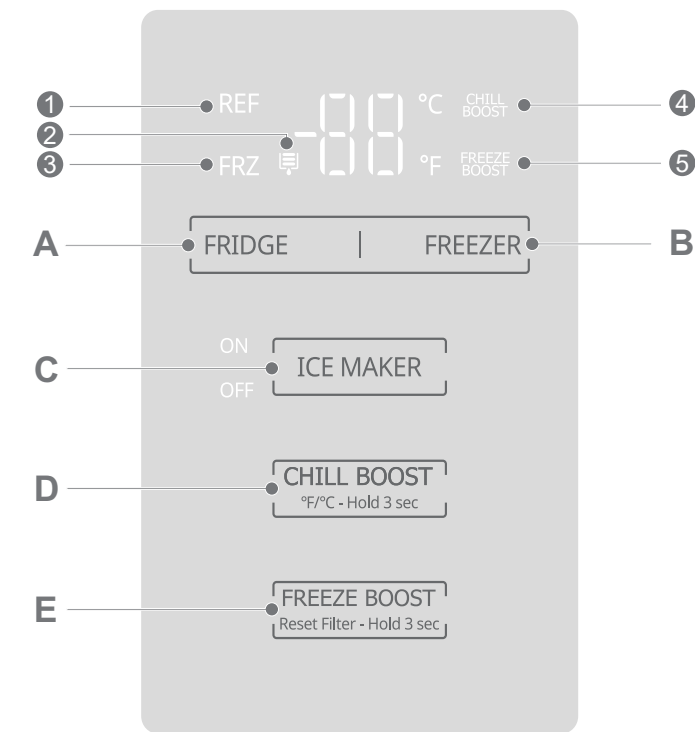
FREEZER DRAWER

- The freezer drawer may keep food fresh for a long time and is primarily used to store frozen foods.
- The freezer drawer is suitable for storage of meat, fish, frozen entrées and intended for foods that will not be consumed in the short term.
- It is recommended to divide large cuts of meat into smaller portions for easier defrosting.
To prevent spoilage and food-borne illness, consume all foods before expiration date.

Note: Storage of too much food during operation after the initial connection to power may adversely affect the freezing performance of the appliance. Food stored should not block the air outlet or otherwise the freezing performance will also be adversely affected.

DISPLAY

Main Display Control (display control on refrigerator left door).

When the power is connected for the first time, the display will illuminate and the start-up chime will sound, and then the display will enter normal operation. (When the appliance is powered on for the first time, the temperatures of the refrigerator and the freezer are set at 37°F/-4°F respectively.)

Under normal conditions, if no doors are opened and no keys are pressed for 30 seconds, the control panel will be locked, and the display will turn off after 30 seconds. If any key is pressed when the display is off, the display screen will wake up and show the current status.

TEMPERATURE MODE

To change the temperature default mode to Celsius or Fahrenheit, press “CHILL BOOST” and hold for 3 seconds.

FILTER ELEMENT TIME RESET

After 330 days of use, the will light up to remind the user to replace the filter. After 360 days, the filter icon will start flashing to prompt the user again. After replacing the filter, the user can press and hold the “FREEZE BOOST” for 3 seconds to activate the “RESET FILTER” function. This will reset the filter timer to zero and turn off the filter indicator icon.

SABBATH MODE

Press and hold the “FREEZE BOOST” button and the “ICE MAKER” for 3 seconds to enter/exit Sabbath mode. After the buttons are activated, “ON” or “OF” will be displayed for 2 seconds respectively, then it will automatically return to the normal display interface. It will take effect after being locked (no button operation for 10 seconds).

ICE MAKER ON/OFF

Press “ICE MAKER” to turn ON or OFF the ice maker and the indicators of the activated ice maker will illuminate on the control panel.

TEMPERATURE SETTINGS

REFRIGERATOR

Press “FRIDGE” to adjust the temperature downward from 44°F/7°C to 34°F/1°C. The temperature will go back to 44°F/7°C from 34°F/1°C.

FREEZER DRAWER

Press “FREEZER” to adjust the temperature downward from 7°F/-14°C to -7°F/-22°C. The temperature will go back to 7°F/-14°C from -7°F/-22°C.

BOOST MODE SETTINGS

CHILL BOOST

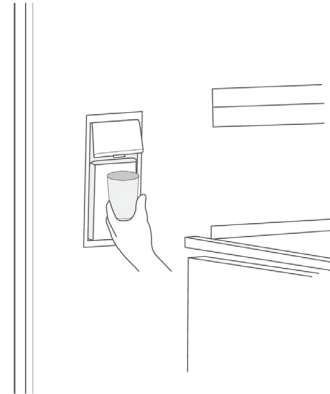
When “REF” on the display panel illuminates, press “CHILL BOOST” to turn on the CHILL BOOST mode. The refrigerator room is set at 34°F/1°C automatically, and the CHILL BOOST icon illuminates. When the CHILL BOOST mode is deactivated, the refrigerator temperature automatically returns to the temperature set before the CHILL BOOST mode was activated.

FREEZE BOOST

When “FRZ” on the display panel illuminates, press “FREEZE BOOST” to turn on the FREEZE BOOST mode. The freezer room is set at -7°F/-22°C automatically, and the FREEZE BOOST icon illuminates. When the FREEZE BOOST mode is deactivated, the freezer temperature automatically returns to the temperature set before the FREEZE BOOST mode was activated.

GET WATER

The water dispenser is located on the left wall inside the refrigerator compartment.



- 1 Hold the cup against the dispenser.
- 2 Place the cup about 1 inch away from the water outlet, and press the dispenser lever to get water.
- 3 Release the water dispenser paddle, then hold the cup under the dispenser for 2-3 seconds to catch all the water.

⚠ CAUTION

- Keep children away from the dispenser to prevent children playing with or damaging the controls.
- If water dispenses unexpectedly, turn off the water supply and contact customer support.
- If the cup rim is small, water may splash out of the cup or miss it completely.

NOTE:

- When using the refrigerator for the first time, it is necessary to perform an air purge; otherwise, water may not dispense.
- Air purge steps: Place a container with a large opening under the water outlet, press and hold the water dispenser button for at least 5 minutes to (approximately 2.5gallon) expel the air and impurities from the water lines. During this process, the noise from the dispenser may be loud due to the air being expelled.
- If the refrigerator has not been used for a long time, please repeat the above steps to remove impurities.

OPERATING REFRIGERATOR

ERROR CODE

When the following tips to appear on the display screen, it indicates a problem with the refrigerator. Although the refrigerator in the following fault case can still provide cool/freeze functions, but the user should contact maintenance personnel, ensure the normal use of refrigerator.

CODE	NAME
E1	The temperature sensor in the refrigerator chamber fails
E2	The temperature sensor in the freezer chamber fails
E5	Frosting sensor for freezer fails
E6	The communication between display board and main control board fails
E7	The ambient temperature fails
EH	The humidity sensor fails
E0	The initialization of ice maker fails
EE	The sensor at the bottom of freezer ice maker fails

OVERALL CLEANING

- Regularly clean the dust and debris behind the refrigerator appliance and the floor to improve cooling performance and energy savings.
- Check the door gasket regularly to make sure there is no debris. Clean the door gasket with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water or diluted detergent.
- The interior of the refrigerator should be cleaned regularly to avoid odor.
- Please unplug the power supply before cleaning interior, remove all foods, drinks, shelves, drawers, etc.
- Use a soft cloth or sponge to clean the inside of the refrigerator, with two tablespoons of baking soda and a quart of warm water. Then rinse with water and wipe clean. After cleaning, open the door and let it air dry before applying power supply.
- For areas that are difficult to clean in the refrigerator (such as narrow spaces, gaps or corners), it is recommended to wipe them regularly with a soft rag, soft brush, etc. and when necessary, combined with some auxiliary tools (such as thin sticks) to ensure no contaminants or bacterial accumulation are in these areas.
- Do not use soap, detergent, scrub powder, spray cleaner, etc., as these may cause odors in the interior of the refrigerator or contaminate food.
- Clean the bottle frame, shelves and drawers with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water or diluted detergent. Dry with a soft cloth or air dry.
- Wipe the outer surface of the refrigerator with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water, detergent, etc., and then wipe dry.
- Do not use hard brushes, clean steel balls, wire brushes, abrasives (such as toothpastes), organic solvents (such as alcohol, acetone, banana oil, etc.), boiling water, acid or alkaline items, which may damage the refrigerator interior. Boiling water and organic solvents such as benzene may deform or damage plastic parts.
- Do not rinse directly with water or other liquids during cleaning to avoid short circuits or damage to electrical insulation after immersion.

⚠ DANGER

Please unplug the refrigerator for defrost and cleaning.

CLEANING OF DOOR BINS

- Use both hands to hold and squeeze the bin, push it upward then remove. See Figure 34.

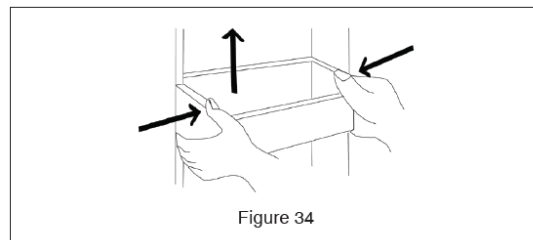
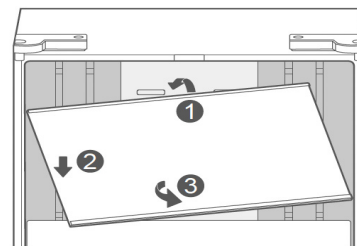

- After washing the bin, reinstall and adjust height as needed.

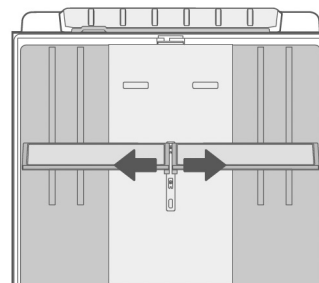
CLEANING OF BIG SHELF

- 1 Hold the front end of the glass shelf with both hands and rotate it in the direction of the arrow until the back end is lifted.
- 2 Grasp the shelf with both hands and slowly slide it towards you.
- 3 Rotate the shelf as indicated by the arrow in the diagram and completely remove it.

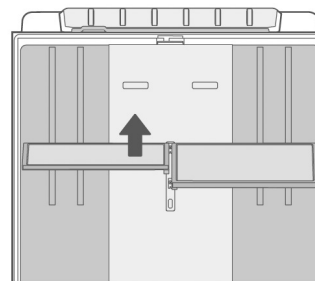


CLEANING OF ADJUSTABLE SHELF

- 1 Pull the two shelves apart in the middle.



- 2 Tilt up the front of the shelf you want to remove until it's free from the other shelf.



- 3 Gently wipe the area that needs cleaning with a damp cloth.
- 4 To assemble, tilt the front of the shelf up and guide the shelf hooks into the slots at a desired height.

CARE AND CLEANING

CLEANING OF FREEZER DRAWER

Pullout drawer: Open the freezer door to the maximum stroke, lift the tail of the upper drawer of the freezing chamber, take out the pullout drawer. See Figure 36.

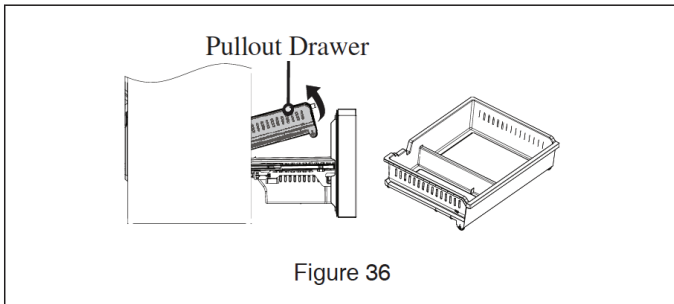

Freezer drawer: Open the freezer door to the maximum stroke, Lift the end of the freezer drawer and lift it up. See Figure 37.

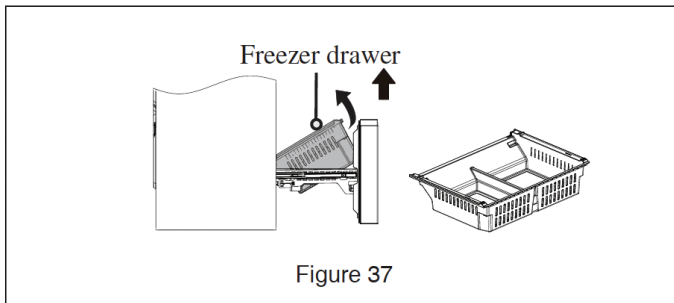

Note: Don't remove the lower freezer drawer if not necessary.

DEFROSTING

The refrigerator is designed based on the air-cooling principle and thus has an automatic defrosting function. Frost formed due to change of season or temperature may also be manually removed by disconnecting the appliance from power supply or by wiping with a dry towel.

REPLACING THE WATER FILTER

The water filter must be replaced every 6 months or if a noticeable reduction in the water flow occurs. When replace is recommended, the Filter Replacement icon will be lit. At this time, replace the water filters following "INSTALLING THE WATER FILTER (P10)". To reset the Filter Replacement icon, hold down "FREEZE BOOST" for 3 seconds and the filter aging data is cleared. For the replacement water filter (Part# SJWF250), please call 1-800-BE-SHARP.

CHANGING THE LIGHT

Any replacement or maintenance of the LED Lamps and others, please call 1-800-BE-SHARP.

OUT OF OPERATION

- Power failure: In case of power failure, foods inside the appliance can be kept for several hours; during the power failure, the times of door opening should be reduced and no more fresh food should be put into the appliance.
- Not use for extended time: The appliance should be unplugged and then cleaned; the doors should be left open to prevent odor.
- Moving: Before the refrigerator is moved, remove all items from inside the appliance, secure the glass partitions, vegetable holder, all drawers, etc., with tape and tighten the leveling feet; close the doors and secure them with tape. During moving, the appliance should not be laid upside down, horizontally or vibrated; the inclination during movement should be no more than 45°.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Before calling for service, the following information may help determine potential cause of appliance concern. Please contact your local dealer or 1-800-BE-SHARP for further assistance.

Appliance has no power	- Confirm the appliance is connected to a power source and securely plugged into an electrical outlet. - Confirm electrical outlet has power, if not, check circuit breaker box for tripped circuit.
Order from refrigerator or freezer compartments	- Foods not securely sealed in containers. - Spoiled foods inside appliance. - Appliance has not been properly cleaned, i. e., food and dirt have accumulated inside the unit.
Excessive compressor operation	- Long operation of the refrigerator is normal in summer when the ambient temperature is high. - Too many food items have been placed inside the appliance, increasing energy demand. - Foods not properly cooled before placing inside appliance. - The doors are opened too frequently.
Light does not come on	- Confirm appliance is connected to power supply and that the light is not damaged. - Have the light replaced by a qualified service technician,
Doors do not close properly	- Food is obstructing the door operation. - The refrigerator is not level.
Rattling noise	- Confirm floor and refrigerator are level and appliance is not tilted. - Confirm water filter is securely installed.
Door does not seal properly	Confirm door seals are clean and free of obstruction.
Water pan overflows	- There is too much food in the freezer or food stored contains too much water, resulting in heavy defrosting. - The doors are not closed properly, resulting in frosting due to entry of air and increased water due to defrosting.
Hot housing	- Heat dissipation of the built-in condenser via housing, which is normal. - When housing becomes hot due to high ambient temperature and storage of too much food, it is recommended to provide proper ventilation to facilitate heat dissipation.
Surface condensation	Condensation on the exterior surface and door seals of the refrigerator is normal when the ambient humidity is too high. Remove the condensation with a clean towel.
Abnormal Noise	- Buzz: The compressor may produce buzzing sound during operation and the buzzing is loud particularly upon start or stop. This is normal. - Creak: Refrigerant flowing inside of the appliance may produce creak, which is normal.
Ice maker does not make ice	- After you install the water line and start the refrigerator, it takes 12 hours to start ice making. - Please turn on the ice making function (see page 17 instructions). - Check whether the water pressure meets 40-100 psi and whether the line is connected properly. - Check whether the water supply valve is open and whether the water pipe has a restriction. - Check whether the ice storage box is installed properly.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Ice dispenser does not work	• Confirm there is ice in the ice storage box. • If ice dispenser has not been used for an extended period of time, ice will melt and stick together. Turn off ice maker, empty ice storage box and replace. Turn on ice maker. • Confirm the water supply line is connected properly, the water supply valve is opened, and the water pipe has no restrictions. • The ice dispenser can only be used when the refrigerator door is closed. • Confirm the ice storage box is installed.
Water dispenser does not work	• Confirm water supply line is connected properly, the water supply valve is opened and the water pipe has no restrictions. • Confirm the water filter is installed in place.
Water dispenser is too slow	• Confirm the water pressure is 40-100 psi. • Replace the water filter.
Water drips from the water dispenser	• It is normal that a few drops of water may drip from the water dispenser. However, if water keeps dripping, please check the connection of the water line.
The water tastes bad	• If the refrigerator is not used for more than 4 days, drain at least 1 gallon of water. • Replace the water filter and follow proper guidelines for filter replacement schedule.
