Chapter 6 — Device Maintenance

6.1 Screen Cleaning (10-point Capacitive G+G Panel)

- Power off before cleaning. Use microfiber cloth + neutral screen cleaner only.
- Do not spray liquid directly on screen; no alcohol, tissue or rough cloth.
- Wipe gently, no hard scraping to protect anti-fingerprint coating.

6.2 Power Adapter Guidelines (12V/3A Type-C)

- Use original 12V/3A PD adapter only. Mismatched power causes hardware damage.
- Handle cable and connector gently; keep adapter ventilated and dry.
- Unplug mains power for long idle periods.

6.3 Operating Temperature & Humidity

- Ambient Temperature: 0 °C ~ +40 °C
- Relative Humidity: 20% ~ 80% (Non-condensing)

6.4 Long-Term Storage

- Fully power off and remove peripherals before storage. Cover with anti-static bag.
- Storage range: -10~35 °C, 10%~70% RH, away from sunlight.
- Power on 30 mins monthly if stored over 30 days to protect lithium battery.

6.5 Firmware Update & Backup

- Keep power connected during firmware upgrade; back up all data first.
- Use official firmware; follow on-screen update guide.
- Regular data backup is suggested to avoid file loss after reset/update.

6.5 Firmware Update & Backup

- Backup all data before reset.
- Do not cut power during reset; all custom settings will revert to factory defaults.

Chapter 8 — FAQ

8.1 Device won't power on / restarts automatically.

- ① Check power connection; Force restart: long-press the hold power button 5–10 sec.
- ② Auto-restart causes: low battery, overheating, or system crash.

8.2 Cannot connect to Wi-Fi (2.4G vs 5G troubleshooting)

- ① Switch between 2.4GHz / 5GHz bands.
- ② Complete captive portal login (hotels, cafes).
- ③ Forget network → reconnect.

8.3 Touch screen unresponsive

- ① Clean screen, remove screen protector.
- ② Calibrate in settings, Clear cache.

8.4 Cannot log into Google Play / download failures

- ① Set date & time to auto.
- ② Clear Play Store cache.
- ③ Check storage space and GMS support.

8.5 eCalendar sync fails

- ① Check Wi-Fi connection.
- ② Trigger manual sync in settings.
- ③ Verify enterprise calendar permissions.

8.6 Screen casting fails

- ① Both devices on same Wi-Fi (5GHz recommended).
- ② Disable VPN or firewall temporarily.

8.7 Bluetooth speaker / display scenarios issue

- ① Ensure Bluetooth is on and paired.
- ② Keep within 10m range.
- ③ Enable Bluetooth Speaker mode.

8.8 Home screen weather / time inaccurate

- ① Enable auto time zone and network time.
- ② Grant location permission. Refresh widget.

8.9 Charging issues / adapter heat

- ① Original the adapter recommended.
- ② Mild warmth = normal. Excessive heat = stop use & contact support.

8.10 External devices not recognized

- ① USB OTG Not Recognized
- ② Use correct USB port.
- ③ Format drive to FAT32 or exFAT.
- ④ Test one device at a time.

8.11 System update failure

- ① Battery ≥30% required.
- ② Restart update if interrupted.
- ③ Contact support for bootloop recovery.

8.12 Cannot activate after factory reset

- ① FRP: log in with previous Google account.
- ② MDM: re-enroll with IT admin.
- ③ Contact us support if still locked.
