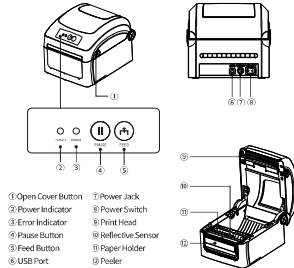
Frequently Asked Questions

- (1) The printer does not detect paper?**
A: The print mechanism sensor may be dirty. Please clean the sensor with a soft brush. If the issue persists after cleaning, contact after-sales support.
- (2) The printout is unclear?**
A: Determine if the entire print area is unclear or only a part. If the entire area is unclear, the thermal paper quality may not meet standards. If only a part is unclear, the print head may be dirty. Please clean the thermal element of the print head with a cotton cloth dipped in alcohol. If the print remains unclear after cleaning, contact after-sales support.
- (3) Unable to connect via Bluetooth?**
A: Restart your phone's Bluetooth and re-enter the application software to connect to the Bluetooth printer.

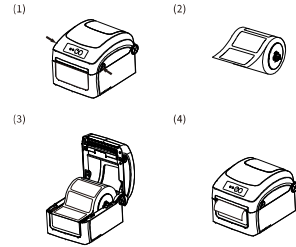

Paper Roll Installation (Peel-Off)

The illustration uses a specific model as an example for demonstration purposes.

- (1) Press the open cover button in the direction indicated by the arrow and lift the upper cover. If there is a paper tube in the paper compartment, please remove it.
- (2) Place the paper roll onto the label supply shaft. Use the paper roll fixing piece to secure the roll in the center of the shaft.
- (3) Position the paper roll correctly on the paper roll holder. (If using a wider paper roll, you can remove the fixing piece and use the paper roll shaft directly.)
- (4) Leave about 1 cm of paper extending outside the paper exit slot, then close the printer's upper cover.

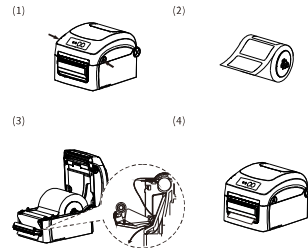

Paper Roll Installation (Optional: Peeling)

The illustration uses a specific model as an example for demonstration purposes.

- (1) Open the printer cover in the direction indicated by the arrow, then lift the upper cover. If there is a paper tube in the paper compartment, remove it.
- (2) Place the paper roll onto the label supply shaft and use the paper roll fixing piece to secure the roll in the center of the shaft. Position the paper roll correctly on the paper roll holder. (If using a wider paper roll, you may remove the fixing piece and use the paper roll shaft directly.)
- (3) Push the peeler upward firmly from the liner exit to open it. Load the consumables following the path shown in the illustration, then close the print head.
- (4) Tighten the liner, press the peeler downward firmly into the slot at an angle to close it, leave about 1 cm of paper extending outside the paper exit slot, and close the printer cover.





Button and Indicator Functions

The illustration uses a specific model as an example for demonstration purposes.

•Button Functions

Feed

In the printer's normal state, press the Feed Button once. Each press will advance the paper by a specified distance.

Pause

During printing, briefly press the Pause Button to pause the print job. Press the Feed Button again to resume printing.

Print Self-Test Page

Turn off the printer power.

Confirm that paper is loaded and the printer cover is closed.

Press and hold the Feed Button, then turn on the printer power.

The printer will print a self-test page. You can then release the Feed Button.

Start Media Learning

In standby mode, press and hold the Feed Button for ≥6 seconds. The Error (Red) indicator will light once, indicating that media learning has been activated.

Cancel Media Learning

In standby mode, press and hold the Feed Button for ≥9 seconds. The Power (Blue) and Error (Red) indicators will flash together three times, and the printer will restore its pre-learning state.

Print Wi-Fi Configuration Page

In standby mode, press and hold the Pause Button for ≥5 seconds. The Error (Red) indicator will light once, and the printer will print a separate Wi-Fi configuration information page.

Reset Wi-Fi Module

In standby mode, press and hold the Pause Button for ≥8 seconds. The Error (Red) indicator will light twice, and the Wi-Fi module information will be reset.

Command Mode Switching (ESC/TSPL/CPCL)

With the printer powered off, press and hold the Pause Button, then turn on the power. Release the Pause Button after the Error (Red) indicator turns off. Upon successful switching, the corresponding mode information page will be printed automatically.

Printer Initialization

- 1) With the printer powered off, simultaneously press and hold both the Pause Button and the Feed Button.
- 2) Turn on the printer power.
- 3) Continue holding the buttons until the Power (Blue) indicator lights up and the Error (Red) indicator turns off, then release both buttons.
- 4) The printer will clear user data from its internal memory, restore all parameters to factory default settings, and the initialization process will be complete.

Important Notes

Precautions for Using the Printer

- (1) Do not disassemble the printer by yourself. Please read this manual carefully before use.
- (2) Do not open the paper compartment cover while the printer is printing, as this may lead to unpredictable situations or even damage the printer.
- (3) After printing, the print head remains at a high temperature. Do not touch it to avoid burns.
- (4) To ensure print quality and extend the product's service life, it is recommended to use the recommended or equivalent quality thermal paper.
- (5) Prevent water or conductive substances (e.g., metal) from entering the printer interior. In case this occurs, immediately turn off the power.
- (6) Always ensure the power is switched off during routine printer maintenance.
- (7) Do not use tools like tweezers to scratch the surfaces of the print head, print platen roller, or sensors.
- (8) Do not operate the printer without paper, as this can severely damage the print platen roller and the thermal print head.

Printer Cleaning

- (1) Clean the print head promptly if the printer exhibits any of the following conditions:

- Unclear printing;
- Unclear printing in a specific vertical column on the page;
- Excessive noise during paper feeding.

- (2) Print Head Cleaning Procedure:

- Turn off the printer power, open the upper cover, and remove any paper if present.
- If printing has just finished, wait for the print head to cool down completely.
- Use a cotton swab dipped in alcohol (concentration ≥75%) to wipe away dust and stains from the surface of the print head's thermal element.
- After the alcohol has completely evaporated, close the upper cover and perform a test print.
