PRODUCT OVERVIEW



Turn in any direction to open the earphone charging case.

PRODUCT OVERVIEW



There are "L" and "R" indicators on both sides of the earphone to help distinguish the left from the right.

Note:

1. For daily use, it is not suggested to frequently open and close the charging case.
2. It is recommended to turn on your phone's Bluetooth first before taking out the earphones.
3. To achieve the best sound quality, please ensure you wear the earphones correctly, distinguishing between the left and right. Due to the unique design of the OWS, wearing them incorrectly may significantly affect sound quality. If you find that the sound quality is poor, try adjusting the fit manually until you achieve optimal listening.

CONNECTION

Turn on:

The earphones wake up automatically when removed from the charging case.

Prompt: Ready? Let's head out.

*To turn on the earphones manually when they are outside the charging case, press and hold both touch panels for 3 seconds.

Turn Off:

The earphones will begin charging when placed back in the charging case (approximately 30mA at constant current) and will turn off once fully charged.

Prompt: Need a break? Till next time then!

*The earphones will automatically turn off if there is no connected device for more than 3 minutes or if the battery voltage drops below 3.0V.

Pairing instructions:

The earphones automatically enter pairing mode when turned on for the first time.

To connect, select "Moondrop U.C.T.S" from the Bluetooth settings of your device while it is in search mode.

Operating follows the prompt:

Connecting: Detecting frequency.

Connected: Resonance established.

Disconnect:

1. Over-distance disconnection: The earbuds will automatically disconnect when beyond the effective working distance, and you'll hear the prompt "Resonance ceased."
2. For manual disconnection, press and hold the left and right earphone control areas simultaneously for 3s to disconnect from the current connection. Alternatively, you can manually turn off the Bluetooth on your smartphone to achieve the same result.

*The earbuds will automatically re-enter pairing mode after disconnection. Other devices can then search for "Moondrop U.C.T.S." to connect and pair.

INSTRUCTIONS

Dual-Device Connectivity Instructions:

Dual-device connectivity is disabled by default and cannot be used in LHDC-V and LC3 modes. If you want to connect a second device, please enable this feature in the "Function Settings" of the MOONDROP app. Once enabled, the dual-device connectivity feature will automatically turn off if there is no second device connected for more than 5 minutes.

Notes for Dual-Device Connectivity:

1. When music is playing from the first device and you attempt to play music from the second device, playback on the first device will pause.
2. The priority order for dual-device connectivity is as follows: calls, audio playback, and standby.

Connecting a Third Device:

1. To connect a third device, one of the currently connected devices must be manually unpaired.
2. In any connection state, press and hold the left and right touch areas simultaneously for 3 seconds to disconnect both devices and connect to a new one.

Automatic Reconnection

1. When the earphones are taken out of the charging case and powered on, they will automatically reconnect to the last connected device. If two devices are present, you will receive a reconnection prompt for both, with priority given to the last connected device.
2. If you disconnect from the effective working range, you can automatically reconnect within 3 minutes.
3. If two devices are connected simultaneously and Device A goes out of range while Device B is nearby, you will need to manually reconnect to Device B using the Bluetooth settings once you're back within range, especially if more than three minutes have passed.

FUNCTION

Function

Play/pause: double-click the left/right touch panel

Pre/Next: triple-click left panel for previous track,
triple-click the right panel for next track

Low-latency mode switching

To switch between modes, quadruple-click the left or right panel and follow the prompts to confirm the current mode.

Music mode: Enjoy the groove.

Game mode (low latency): Let the battle begin!

Answering calls: Double-click the left/right earbud

Rejecting calls: Press and hold the left/right earbud for 1.5s

Ending calls: Double-click the left/right earbud

Third-party incoming call: Double-click the left/right earbud

Switching between third-party calls: Triple-click the left/right earbud

*When you properly click the touch-panel area, the system will provide audible feedback with a "beep" prompt.

BATTERY INDICATION

Battery indication

Charging indicator (Charging case)

The orange indicator is always on while charging, and it will turn off once the case is fully charged.

Charging Indicator (Earbud)

When the earbuds have low battery (voltage below 3.3V),

Prompt: Maybe a brief rest to recharge.

When the earphone is put into the charging case

Regular power $\geq 10\%$: white indicator is always on.

Low battery $< 10\%$: Orange indicator flashes at 1Hz.

The LED indicator turns off when the earphones are fully charged.

When charging both the case and the earphones simultaneously, the charging case's indicator takes priority.

Restore factory settings

Press and hold the touch area on both earphones for 8 seconds to clear the stored pairing information and restore factory settings.

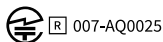
